

Our People

The 2000 U.S. Census reported total population as **8,286**.² The graph below indicates the percentage by age group.

Spotlight on . . .

Accessing Nutritious Food



In Ballard County, various activities were organized to educate the community as to the importance of their food choices. A workshop for Senior Citizen program participants, led by the FCS agent, discussed healthy food choices for their life stage, food safety, and ways to increase physical activity to prevent chronic disease. A booth at a health fair distributed literature on healthy food choices and provided participants sample smart snack choices. The Health Department's Cervical Cancer screening clinic participants were given literature on nutrition and tasted healthy snacks prepared using recipes from the Nutrition Education Program. ¹

Our Families

Using data from the 2000 U.S. Census, Ballard County families can be described as follows:²

- 2,454 families reside in the county.
- 263 families (10.7%) live below poverty level.
- Median family income is \$41,836.
- **84** grandparents are responsible for the care of their grandchildren.

According to the Kentucky Cabinet for Health and Family Services, **920** people in Ballard County receive food stamps. The average family food stamp benefit is **\$209.37** per month.³

In the county, **12** children live in out-of-home care.⁴ In 2004, there were **2** incidents of adult abuse and **3** incidents of child abuse.⁵

As a result of participation in Ballard County Extension programs:¹

- **43** adults and youth improved their ability to make informed and effective decisions.
- **55** people adopted money management practices to reduce debt and/or increase savings.
- **20** people used safe practices to store, handle and prepare food.
- **1,371** food stamp eligible or recipient families consumed more fruits and vegetables daily.

Our Community

Unemployment rates are a key economic indicator. In September 2008, the rate of unemployment in Ballard County was **5.9%**. This represented a **23%** increase from the September 2007 level of **4.8%**.⁶

Mortgage and bank card delinquency rates and foreclosure filings are important financial indicators of community well-being. In Ballard County, 90-day mortgage delinquency rates have increased by 2% and 60-day bank card delinquency rates have increased by 18%.⁷ In a six-month period (May through October 2008), 17 foreclosures were filed.⁸

Access to health insurance is another important factor contributing to family well-being. In Ballard County, **12%** of the people under age 65 are uninsured.⁹


As a result of participation in Ballard County Extension programs:¹

- 35 adults and youth utilized improved communication, problem solving, and group process skills to address community needs.
- **89** people were involved in addressing issues of their community.

Our Health

The health of our people contributes to quality of life. The chart below illustrates health risks of adults in Ballard County.

As a result of participation in Ballard County Extension programs:¹

- **66** people made lifestyle changes to improve physical health.
- 18 people implemented new practices to maintain health and well-being
- 144 people increased their use of radon testers, smoke detectors, fire extinguishers, and other devices to ensure personal safety.
