



any Americans have experienced serious problems related to their health including being overweight and/or developing chronic diseases. Additionally, many have experienced financial difficulties such as high debt and low savings. Limited resource families (past Christmas Project recipients) were invited to participate in the six week self-discovery education, skill building program "Small Steps to Health and Wealth". The program included developing an exercise program, keeping daily food intake records, developing a financial budget, and keeping records of money spent. Twenty-one families completed the Small Steps to Health and Wealth Series. The final evaluation showed: Ninety percent developed a budget, 95% prepared foods from workshop for family members,

60% kept track of food intake regularly, 75% kept written records of money spent, and 50% increased exercise since attending the program.¹





OUR COMMUNITY

► Unemployment rates are a key economic indicator. In August 2009, the rate of unemployment in Owen County was 10.4%.³

Mortgage and bank card delinquency rates and foreclosure filings are important financial indicators of community well-being. In Owen County,

As a result of participation in Owen County Extension programs:¹


- 82 people were involved in addressing issues of their community.
- 25 people were prepared to enter the work force.
- 34 people expanded their knowledge of economic development.

3.55% of mortgages are 90-days delinquent and 60-day bank card delinquency rates have increased by **4.52%**.⁴ In a one-year period (October 2008 through October 2009), **76** foreclosures were filed.⁵

Access to health insurance is another important factor contributing to family well-being. In Owen County, **15%** of the people under age 65 are uninsured.⁶

OUR HEALTH

► The health of our people contributes to quality of life. The chart below illustrates health risks of adults in Owen County. Figure 2. Health Risks.⁶




As a result of participation in Owen County Extension programs:¹

- **300** people increased knowledge of practices to maintain health and well-being.
- **575** people increase knowledge of safe practices to store, handle, and prepare food.
- **500** people implemented practices to maintain health and well-being.

OUR FAMILIES

- ► Using data from the 2000 U.S. Census, Owen County families can be described as follows:²
- 2,996 families reside in the county.
- 367 families (12.1%) live below poverty level.
- Median family income is \$38,844.
- **96** grandparents are responsible for the care of their grandchildren.



According to the Kentucky Cabinet for Health and Family Services, **661** people in Owen County receive food stamps. The average family food stamp benefit is **\$225.92** per month.⁷

In the county, 8 children live in out-of-home care.8

In 2005, there were **37** incidents of adult abuse and **40** incidents of child abuse.⁹

As a result of participation in Owen County Extension programs:¹

- 280 adults and youth improved their ability to make informed and effective decisions.
- 250 people adopted money management practices to reduce debt and/or increase savings.
- 200 people increased their knowledge and skills related to parenting and personal relationships.
