



# MAKING BENEFICIAL LIFESTYLE CHOICES

ccording to the Kentucky Institute of Medicine, 2007, Wolfe County ranks 120th out of 120 counties for being the unhealthiest in the state. To combat the overweight problem and help residents become more physical activity, Wolfe County Extension partnered with the local health department and diabetes coalition to conduct the "Weight, The Reality Series." Fifty-one participates committed to attending the program in five locations for 10 weeks. Teams at each location competed with other teams to see which one could lose the most weight. Each week, participants weighed in, participated in

and educational program and finished with a walk. The 41 people who completed the program lost a combine 240 pounds, or an average of 4.57 pounds per person. One team of 10 members lost 71 pounds total.<sup>1</sup>





#### **OUR COMMUNITY**

The unemployment rates are a key economic indicator. In August 2009, the rate of unemployment in Wolfe County was 14.2%.3

Mortgage and bank card delinquency rates and foreclosure filings are important financial indicators of community well-being. In Wolfe County,

## As a result of participation in Wolfe County Extension programs:<sup>1</sup>


- 67 people were involved in addressing issues of their community.
- 18 people increased their knowledge of governmental process.
- 94 people expanded their knowledge of economic development.

**0.84**% of mortgages are 90-days delinquent and 60-day bank card delinquency rates have increased by **3.28**%.<sup>4</sup> In a one-year period (October 2008 through October 2009), **1** foreclosures were filed.<sup>5</sup>

Access to health insurance is another important factor contributing to family well-being. In Wolfe County, **21%** of the people under age 65 are uninsured.<sup>6</sup>

### **OUR HEALTH**

► The health of our people contributes to quality of life. The chart below illustrates health risks of adults in Wolfe County. Figure 2. Health Risks.<sup>6</sup>




### As a result of participation in Wolfe County Extension programs:<sup>1</sup>

- **240** people increased knowledge of practices to maintain health and well-being.
- **305** people increase knowledge of safe practices to store, handle, and prepare food.
- **39** people increased their use of radon testers, smoke detectors, fire extinguishers, and other devices to ensure personal safety.

#### **OUR FAMILIES**

- ► Using data from the 2000 U.S. Census, Wolfe County families can be described as follows:<sup>2</sup>
- 1,977 families reside in the county.
- 610 families (29.9%) live below poverty level.
- Median family income is \$23,333.
- **41** grandparents are responsible for the care of their grandchildren.



According to the Kentucky Cabinet for Health and Family Services, 1,311 people in Wolfe County receive food stamps. The average family food stamp benefit is \$194.63 per month.<sup>7</sup>

In the county, **99** children live in out-of-home care.<sup>8</sup>

In 2005, there were **32** incidents of adult abuse and **47** incidents of child abuse.<sup>9</sup>

## As a result of participation in Wolfe County Extension programs:<sup>1</sup>

- 710 adults and youth improved their ability to make informed and effective decisions
- 700 people adopted money management practices to reduce debt and/or increase savings.
- **702** adults and youth improved practical living skills.
