

reported total population as **44,829**.<sup>2</sup> The graph on the right indicates the percentage by age group.



# ACCESSING NUTRITIOUS FOOD

iving on a budget has become very real to Henderson County residents who are coping with high unemployment and tough economic times. Food purchases, a major expense in a family budget, can be reduced through planning and using coupons. To teach wise food shopping a couponing class was offered by the Family and Consumer Sciences Agent. Eighty-six participants attended five classes, with many of them reporting spending over \$200 a week on groceries. The goal of this

program was to cut monthly grocery bills by 25% per month. As a result, participants started a club that meets monthly to exchange coupons and share buying information. Members say they are saving \$50-\$100 on each grocery trip.1





#### OUR COMMUNITY

Unemployment rates are a key economic indicator. In July 2010, the rate of unemployment in Henderson County was 9.0%.<sup>6</sup>

Mortgage and bank card delinquency rates and foreclosure filings are important financial indicators of community well-being. In Henderson County, **2.5%** of mortgages are 90-days delinquent and **1.2%** of bank cards

#### As a result of participation in Henderson County Extension programs:<sup>1</sup>


- **53** people were involved in addressing issues of their community.
- 23 people increased their knowledge of governmental process.
- 23 people expanded their knowledge of economic development.
- Henderson County Extension is involved in **13** community coalitions.

are 60-days delinquent.<sup>7</sup> In a one-year period (August 2009 through August 2010), **136** foreclosures were filed.<sup>5</sup>

Access to health insurance is another important factor contributing to family well-being. In Henderson County, **12%** of the people under age 65 are uninsured.<sup>8</sup>

# OUR HEALTH

► The health of our people contributes to quality of life. The chart below illustrates health risks of adults in Henderson County. *Figure 2. Health Risks.*<sup>8</sup>



#### As a result of participation in Henderson County Extension programs:<sup>1</sup>

- **469** people increased knowledge of practices to maintain health and well-being.
- **148** people increased knowledge of safe practices to store, handle, and prepare food.
- 236 people made lifestyle changes to improve health.

### OUR FAMILIES

- ▶ Using data from the 2000 U.S. Census, Henderson County families can be described as follows:<sup>2</sup>
- 12,570 families reside in the county.
- 1,218 families (9.7%) live below poverty level.
- Median family income is **\$44,703**.
- **443** grandparents are responsible for the care of their grandchildren.



According to the Kentucky Cabinet for Health and Family Services, **2,939** people in Henderson County receive supplemental nutrition assistance. The average family benefit is **\$240.25** per month.<sup>3</sup>

In the county, **99** children live in out-of-home care. There were **207** 

child victims of substantiated abuse.<sup>4</sup> There were **270** incidents of adult abuse.<sup>5</sup>

#### As a result of participation in Henderson County Extension programs:<sup>1</sup>

- 23 adults and youth improved their ability to make informed and effective decisions.
- 23 people adopted money management practices to reduce debt and/or increase savings.
- **250** adults and youth improved practical living skills.
