

Figure 1. Population by Age Group<sup>2</sup> (n=9,804)



## NURTURING FAMILIES

he Livingston County Expanded Food and Nutrition Education Program and the Family and Consumer Sciences program partnered with Adult Education and the Community Early Childhood Council to conduct "Friday Night Family Fun" literacy programs. The family-based programs model reading to children; teach simple nutritious snacks while introducing families to new foods; provide an opportunity for parents and children to work together on a craft; and give each child or family a book to take

home. Three different Friday events had approximately 200 participants. As a result, many parents have reported reading more often to their children. Parents also report that children have responded positively to new nutritious foods.1





#### **OUR COMMUNITY**

► Unemployment rates are a key economic indicator. In July 2010, the rate of unemployment in Livingston County was 8.7%.

Mortgage and bank card delinquency rates and foreclosure filings are important financial indicators of community well-being. In Livingston County, 2.2% of mortgages are 90-days delinquent and 1.9% of bank cards are 60-days delin-


- 84 people were involved in addressing issues of their community.
- 26 people increased their knowledge of governmental process.
- 124 people expanded their knowledge of economic development.
- Livingston County Extension is involved in 15 community coalitions.

quent.<sup>7</sup> In a one-year period (August 2009 through August 2010), **14** foreclosures were filed.<sup>5</sup>

Access to health insurance is another important factor contributing to family well-being. In Livingston County, **13%** of the people under age 65 are uninsured.<sup>8</sup>

### **OUR HEALTH**

➤ The health of our people contributes to quality of life. The chart below illustrates health risks of adults in Livingston County. *Figure 2. Health Risks.*<sup>8</sup>



### As a result of participation in Livingston County Extension programs:<sup>1</sup>

- **483** people increased knowledge of practices to maintain health and well-being.
- **883** people implemented practices to maintain health and well-being.
- 172 people increased their use of radon testers, smoke detectors, fire extinguishers, and other devices to ensure personal safety.

#### **OUR FAMILIES**

- ▶ Using data from the 2000 U.S. Census, Livingston County families can be described as follows:²
- 2,893 families reside in the county.
- 219 families (7.6%) live below poverty level.
- Median family income is \$39,486.
- **54** grandparents are responsible for the care of their grandchildren.



According to the Kentucky Cabinet for Health and Family Services, **524** people in Livingston County receive supplemental nutrition assistance. The average family benefit is **\$236.45** per month.<sup>3</sup>

In the county, 12 children live in out-of-home care. There were 21

child victims of substantiated abuse.<sup>4</sup> There were **25** incidents of adult abuse.<sup>5</sup>

### As a result of participation in Livingston County Extension programs:<sup>1</sup>

- 295 adults and youth improved their ability to make informed and effective decisions.
- **51** people adopted money management practices to reduce debt and/or increase savings.
- **260** adults and youth improved practical living skills.
