

Figure 1. Population by Age Group<sup>2</sup> (n=8,080)



erious health issues such as diabetes, cancer, and obesity are of great concern in Lyon County. To improve the health of elementaryage youth, the University of Kentucky Cooperative Extension Service sponsored 18 classroom programs. Each program provided information on MyPyramid, food safety, the importance of breakfast, healthy snacking, dental hygiene, easy-to-fix foods, and physical fitness. Parents were surveyed to determine program impact, with 230 families of the 371 participating students responding. As a result of participa-

tion, 200 are more dedicated to breakfast; 187 are more dedicated to handwashing; 154 are more interested in brushing or flossing their teeth; 150 are more likely to drink milk or eat calcium-rich foods; and 148 tried wholegrain foods.1





### **OUR COMMUNITY**

► Unemployment rates are a key economic indicator. In July 2010, the rate of unemployment in Lyon County was **9.7%**.6

Mortgage and bank card delinquency rates and foreclosure filings are important financial indicators of community well-being. In Lyon County, **2.1%** of mortgages are 90-days delinquent and **1.1%** of bank cards

## As a result of participation in Lyon County Extension programs:<sup>1</sup>


- 107 people were involved in addressing issues of their community.
- **60** people were prepared to enter the work force.
- 49 people expanded their knowledge of economic development.
- Lyon County Extension is involved in 10 community coalitions.

are 60-days delinquent.<sup>7</sup> In a one-year period (August 2009 through August 2010), **22** foreclosures were filed.<sup>5</sup>

Access to health insurance is another important factor contributing to family well-being. In Lyon County, **12%** of the people under age 65 are uninsured.<sup>8</sup>

### **OUR HEALTH**

➤ The health of our people contributes to quality of life. The chart below illustrates health risks of adults in Lyon County. *Figure 2. Health Risks.*<sup>8</sup>



### As a result of participation in Lyon County Extension programs:<sup>1</sup>

- **650** people increased knowledge of practices to maintain health and well-being.
- 210 people increased knowledge of safe practices to store, handle, and prepare food.
- 134 people developed skills to access affordable food.

### **OUR FAMILIES**

- ► Using data from the 2000 U.S. Census, Lyon County families can be described as follows:<sup>2</sup>
- 2,043 families reside in the county.
- 212 families (10.2%) live below poverty level.
- Median family income is \$39,940.
- **68** grandparents are responsible for the care of their grandchildren.



According to the Kentucky Cabinet for Health and Family Services, **349** people in Lyon County receive supplemental nutrition assistance. The average family benefit is **\$217.97** per month.<sup>3</sup>

In the county, 24 children live in out-of-home care. There were 72 child victims of

substantiated abuse.<sup>4</sup> There were **27** incidents of adult abuse.<sup>5</sup>

### As a result of participation in Lyon County Extension programs:<sup>1</sup>

- 193 adults and youth improved their ability to make informed and effective decisions.
- **400** adults and youth improved practical living skills.
- 60 people increased their knowledge and skills related to parenting and personal relationships.
