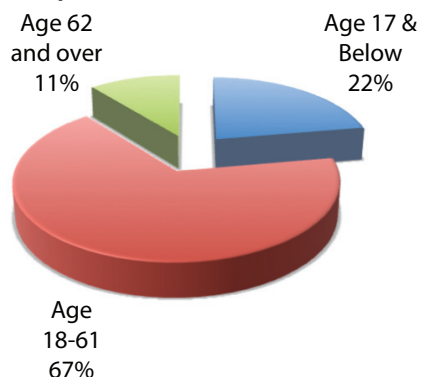

SPOTLIGHT ON...

PROMOTING HEALTHY HOMES AND COMMUNITIES

According to a survey conducted by Berea College and Kentuckians for the Commonwealth, 94% of Madison County residents have been negatively impacted by escalating energy costs. Because they rely on inexpensive coal as a main energy source, Kentuckians use 70% more electricity than the average American. This far-reaching topic provided the Extension Council with an opportunity to provide education on energy efficiency and conservation and to promote local businesses that provide energy-efficient products and services. Thirty exhibitors participated in the Energy Expo, with 350 people attending. Participants when polled stated that they plan to make energy saving changes through home weatherization, using CFL bulbs, recycling, composting, and using energy efficient appliances.¹



OUR COMMUNITY

► Unemployment rates are a key economic indicator. In July 2010, the rate of unemployment in Madison County was **8.5%**.⁶

Mortgage and bank card delinquency rates and foreclosure filings are important financial indicators of community well-being. In Madison County, **3.5%** of mortgages are 90-days delinquent and **1.5%** of bank cards are 60-days delinquent.⁷ In a one-year period (August 2009 through August 2010), **418** foreclosures were filed.⁵

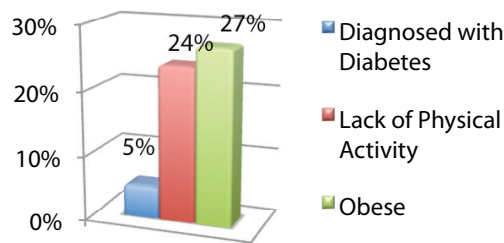
Access to health insurance is another important factor contributing to family well-being. In Madison County, **13%** of the people under age 65 are uninsured.⁸

As a result of participation in Madison County Extension programs:¹

- **643** people were involved in addressing issues of their community.
- **417** people were prepared to enter the work force.
- **1,250** people expanded their knowledge of economic development.
- Madison County Extension is involved in **65** community coalitions.

OUR HEALTH

► The health of our people contributes to quality of life. The chart below illustrates health risks of adults in Madison County. **Figure 2. Health Risks.**⁸



As a result of participation in Madison County Extension programs:¹

- **9,000** people increased knowledge of practices to maintain health and well-being.
- **2,500** people increased knowledge of safe practices to store, handle, and prepare food.
- **3,490** people increased their use of radon testers, smoke detectors, fire extinguishers, and other devices to ensure personal safety.

OUR FAMILIES

► Using data from the 2000 U.S. Census, Madison County families can be described as follows:²

- **18,218** families reside in the county.
- **2,204** families (**12%**) live below poverty level.
- Median family income is **\$41,383**.
- **546** grandparents are responsible for the care of their grandchildren.



According to the Kentucky Cabinet for Health and Family Services, **5,079** people in Madison County receive supplemental nutrition assistance. The average family benefit is **\$252.66** per month.³

In the county, **222** children live in out-of-home care. There were **283**

child victims of substantiated abuse.⁴ There were **197** incidents of adult abuse.⁵

As a result of participation in Madison County Extension programs:¹

- **6,500** adults and youth improved their ability to make informed and effective decisions.
- **1,765** adults and youth improved practical living skills.
- **1,122** people increased their knowledge and skills related to parenting and personal relationships.
