ACCESSING NUTRITIOUS FOOD

nterest in food preservation has been on the rise recently. This growth is due to a greater number of people raising home gardens as well as increased shopping for local, seasonal foods at the Menifee County Farmer's Market. Menifee County Extension Service provided a three-part food preservation series that reached ten families. The Extension office has also received an increased number of calls regarding food preservation since the beginning of the series. For many people this was their first experience with food preservation. Extension Service has worked to provide up-to-date information on food preservation for those who are beginners as well as those who have done it for a lifetime.¹





OUR COMMUNITY

Unemployment rates are a key economic indicator. In July 2010, the rate of unemployment in Menifee County was 15.4%.⁶

Mortgage and bank card delinquency rates and foreclosure filings are important financial indicators of community well-being. In Menifee County, **2.3%** of mortgages are 90-days delinquent and **5.2%** of bank cards

As a result of participation in Menifee County Extension programs:¹

- **12** people were involved in addressing issues of their community.
- **12** people expanded their knowledge of economic development.
- **12** people were prepared to enter the work force.
- Menifee County Extension is involved in **2** community coalitions.

are 60-days delinquent.⁷ In a one-year period (August 2009 through August 2010), **46** foreclosures were filed.⁵

Access to health insurance is another important factor contributing to family well-being. In Menifee County, **19%** of the people under age 65 are uninsured.⁸

OUR HEALTH

► The health of our people contributes to quality of life. The chart below illustrates health risks of adults in Menifee County. *Figure 2. Health Risks.*⁸



As a result of participation in Menifee County Extension programs:¹

- **65** people increased knowledge of practices to maintain health and well-being.
- **70** people increased knowledge of safe practices to store, handle, and prepare food.
- 60 people developed skills to access affordable food.

OUR FAMILIES

- ► Using data from the 2000 U.S. Census, Menifee County families can be described as follows:²
- 1,900 families reside in the county.
- 441 families (23.4%) live below poverty level.
- Median family income is **\$26,325**.
- **74** grandparents are responsible for the care of their grandchildren.



According to the Kentucky Cabinet for Health and Family Services, **832** people in Menifee County receive supplemental nutrition assistance. The average family benefit is **\$250.21** per month.³

In the county, **13** children live in out-of-home care. There were **71**

child victims of substantiated abuse.⁴ There were **14** incidents of adult abuse.⁵

As a result of participation in Menifee County Extension programs:¹

- **150** adults and youth improved their ability to make informed and effective decisions.
- **70** adult or child care providers increased their knowledge and skills related to age appropriate care.
- **162** adults and youth improved practical living skills.
