



Figure 1. Population by Age Group² (n=10,547)





MAKING BENEFICIAL LIFESTYLE CHOICES

ecently the Journal of the American Medical Association stated that an "obesity-hunger paradox" arises from lack of nutritious, affordable alternatives to fast foods and lack of knowledge about preparing nutritious, inexpensive food. Extension staff and volunteers implemented a six-day event called Recipes for Life. Fifth graders prepared lunch using basic ingredients and cooking techniques, and were taught nutrition and food safety. After, students stated they used the recipes and helped their families prepare meals. Also during the program the fifth graders detected kitchen

hazards to raise awareness of safety. Written comments from the 120 students included: "Not to leave knives out on the counter." "Don't have an apron around the stove." "Make sure your kitchen is organized." "Clean up your kitchen."





OUR COMMUNITY

► Unemployment rates are a key economic indicator. In July 2010, the rate of unemployment in Owen County was 9.1%.6

Mortgage and bank card delinquency rates and foreclosure filings are important financial indicators of community well-being. In Owen County, **3.1%** of mortgages are 90-days delinquent and **1.5%** of bank cards are 60-days delin-


- 203 people were involved in addressing issues of their community.
- 150 people increased their knowledge of governmental process.
- 145 people expanded their knowledge of economic development.
- Owen County Extension is involved in 24 community coalitions.

quent.⁷ In a one-year period (August 2009 through August 2010), **94** foreclosures were filed.⁵

Access to health insurance is another important factor contributing to family well-being. In Owen County, **15%** of the people under age 65 are uninsured.⁸

OUR HEALTH

► The health of our people contributes to quality of life. The chart below illustrates health risks of adults in Owen County. *Figure 2. Health Risks.**



As a result of participation in Owen County Extension programs:¹

- **350** people increased knowledge of practices to maintain health and well-being.
- **515** people increased knowledge of safe practices to store, handle, and prepare food.
- 200 people made lifestyle changes to improve health.

OUR FAMILIES

- ► Using data from the 2000 U.S. Census, Owen County families can be described as follows:²
- 2,996 families reside in the county.
- 367 families (12.1%) live below poverty level.
- Median family income is \$38,844.
- **96** grandparents are responsible for the care of their grandchildren.



According to the Kentucky Cabinet for Health and Family Services, **711** people in Owen County receive supplemental nutrition assistance. The average family benefit is **\$254.56** per month.³

In the county, 5 children live in out-of-home care. There were 25

child victims of substantiated abuse.⁴ There were **26** incidents of adult abuse.⁵

As a result of participation in Owen County Extension programs:¹

- 170 adults and youth improved their ability to make informed and effective decisions.
- 30 people adopted money management practices to reduce debt and/or increase savings.
- **200** adults and youth improved practical living skills.
