



Figure 1. Population by Age Group<sup>2</sup> (n=4,858)





# MAKING BENEFICIAL LIFESTYLE CHOICES

lanning groups for Second Sunday determined that encouraging physical activity and eradicating drug abuse are paramount health concerns in Owsley County. Two grants were used to put a drug-fee message on water bottles and T-shirts distributed at multiple Second Sunday physical activity stations. Approximately 180 individuals participated from the community. The event boasted 17 partnerships, 40 volunteers, and donations totaling \$1025. Volunteer hours of 250 had an estimated value of \$2,298. Owsley County Extension was one

of three counties that assisted with Second Sunday at Buckhorn Lake State Park, reaching an additional 21 individuals. Lastly, a \$500 service learning grant will be used by 4-H teens to develop a brochure highlighting the county's opportunities for exercise.1





#### **OUR COMMUNITY**

► Unemployment rates are a key economic indicator. In July 2010, the rate of unemployment in Owsley County was 11.2%.6

Foreclosure filings are important financial indicators of community well-being. In a one-year period (August 2009 through August 2010), **1** foreclosure was filed in Owsley County.<sup>5</sup>

Access to health insurance is another im-



portant factor contributing to family well-being. In Owsley County, **25%** of the people under age 65 are uninsured.<sup>8</sup>

### **OUR HEALTH**

➤ The health of our people contributes to quality of life. The chart below illustrates health risks of adults in Owsley County. *Figure 2. Health Risks.*<sup>8</sup>



### As a result of participation in Owsley County Extension programs:<sup>1</sup>

- **2,306** people increased knowledge of practices to maintain health and well-being.
- **1,340** people used safe practices to store, handle, and prepare food.
- **2,345** people made lifestyle changes to improve health.

### **OUR FAMILIES**

- ► Using data from the 2000 U.S. Census, Owsley County families can be described as follows:<sup>2</sup>
- 1,388 families reside in the county.
- 587 families (41.7%) live below poverty level.
- Median family income is \$18,034.
- **140** grandparents are responsible for the care of their grandchildren.



According to the Kentucky Cabinet for Health and Family Services, **1,222** people in Owsley County receive supplemental nutrition assistance. The average family benefit is **\$195.60** per month.<sup>3</sup>

In the county, **32** children live in out-of-home care. There were **62** 

child victims of substantiated abuse.<sup>4</sup> There were **13** incidents of adult abuse.<sup>5</sup>

### As a result of participation in Owsley County Extension programs:<sup>1</sup>

- 1,055 adults and youth improved their ability to make informed and effective decisions.
- 780 people increased their knowledge and skills related to parenting and personal relationships.
- **2,768** adults and youth improved practical living skills.
