Family and Consumer Sciences Extension is committed to improving the quality of life for individuals and families in Warren County resulting in strong families for Kentucky. Educational programs focus on:



 by age group.



PROMOTING HEALTHY HOMES AND COMMUNITIES

entucky has the nation's 16th highest stroke mortality rate and ranks 7th in cardiovascular disease death rates (2005). Heart disease can be prevented by controlling risk factors such as smoking and encouraging exercise, healthy eating, and yearly screenings. The Warren County Extension Agent for Family & Consumer Sciences trained 81 Extension Homemakers with "Staying Healthy— Prevention & Screenings: Know Your Numbers." Ninety-five percent said they would share some of the information with family and/or friends; 88% said

they plan to get cholesterol, blood pressure, blood sugar, and waist circumference checked at least once a year; and 88% also said they plan to make lifestyle changes to improve their overall health.¹





OUR COMMUNITY

Unemployment rates are a key economic indicator. In July 2010, the rate of unemployment in Warren County was 8.9%.⁶

Mortgage and bank card delinquency rates and foreclosure filings are important financial indicators of community well-being. In Warren County, **2.1%** of mortgages are 90-days delinquent and **1.3%** of bank cards are 60-days delin-


- **867** people were involved in addressing issues of their community.
- **256** people increased their knowledge of governmental process.
- **441** people expanded their knowledge of economic development.
- Warren County Extension is involved in **49** community coalitions.

quent.⁷ In a one-year period (August 2009 through August 2010), **433** foreclosures were filed.⁵

Access to health insurance is another important factor contributing to family well-being. In Warren County, **13%** of the people under age 65 are uninsured.⁸

OUR HEALTH

The health of our people contributes to quality of life. The chart below illustrates health risks of adults in Warren County. Figure 2. Health Risks.⁸



As a result of participation in Warren County Extension programs:¹

- **1,868** people increased knowledge of practices to maintain health and well-being.
- **1,902** people increased knowledge of safe practices to store, handle, and prepare food.
- **2,154** people made lifestyle changes to improve health.

OUR FAMILIES

- Using data from the 2000 U.S. Census, Warren County families can be described as follows:²
- 23,427 families reside in the county.
- 2,559 families (10.8%) live below poverty level.
- Median family income is **\$45,142**.
- **878** grandparents are responsible for the care of their grandchildren.



According to the Kentucky Cabinet for Health and Family Services, **6,101** people in Warren County receive supplemental nutrition assistance. The average family benefit is **\$250.20** per month.³

In the county, **454** children live in out-of-home care. There were **260**

child victims of substantiated abuse.⁴ There were **513** incidents of adult abuse.⁵

As a result of participation in Warren County Extension programs:¹

- **1,669** adults and youth improved their ability to make informed and effective decisions.
- **3,166** people adopted money management practices to reduce debt and/or increase savings.
- **2,907** adults and youth improved practical living skills.
