

2008 estimates from the 2000 U.S. Census reported total population as **35,865**.<sup>2</sup> The graph on the right indicates the percentage by age group.



# SECURING FINANCIAL STABILITY

Uring these hard economic times, Whitley County residents have been experiencing negative issues related to personal health and finances. To address these issues, the Extension Agent for Family and Consumer Sciences presented a six-week series, "Small Steps to Health and Wealth," that motivated 235 participants to improve personal finances and overall health. Participants were given survival kits containing calculators, pedometers, books on nutrition and calorie counting, and "Small Steps to Health and Wealth" manuals. Everyone

made journals to track spending, food intake, and physical activity; and created banks to contribute money to daily. The small change-big difference mantra helped 235 participants save a combined total over six weeks of \$12,750.1





#### OUR COMMUNITY

Unemployment rates are a key economic indicator. In July 2010, the rate of unemployment in Whitley County was 11.1%.<sup>6</sup>

Mortgage and bank card delinquency rates and foreclosure filings are important financial indicators of community well-being. In Whitley County, **2.5%** of mortgages are 90-days delinquent and **1.8%** of bank cards

#### As a result of participation in Whitley County Extension programs:<sup>1</sup>


- **228** people were involved in addressing issues of their community.
- **468** people increased their knowledge of governmental process.
- **58** people were prepared to enter the work force.
- Whitley County Extension is involved in **31** community coalitions.

are 60-days delinquent.<sup>7</sup> In a one-year period (August 2009 through August 2010), **151** foreclosures were filed.<sup>5</sup>

Access to health insurance is another important factor contributing to family well-being. In Whitley County, **19%** of the people under age 65 are uninsured.<sup>8</sup>

# OUR HEALTH

The health of our people contributes to quality of life. The chart below illustrates health risks of adults in Whitley County. *Figure 2. Health Risks.*<sup>8</sup>



#### As a result of participation in Whitley County Extension programs:<sup>1</sup>

- **650** people increased knowledge of practices to maintain health and well-being.
- **250** people increased knowledge of safe practices to store, handle, and prepare food.
- **250** people developed skills to access affordable food.

# OUR FAMILIES

- ► Using data from the 2000 U.S. Census, Whitley County families can be described as follows:<sup>2</sup>
- 9,888 families reside in the county.
- 2,163 families (21.6%) live below poverty level.
- Median family income is **\$27,871**.
- **390** grandparents are responsible for the care of their grandchildren.



According to the Kentucky Cabinet for Health and Family Services, **4,668** people in Whitley County receive supplemental nutrition assistance. The average family benefit is **\$244.60** per month.<sup>3</sup>

In the county, **99** children live in out-of-home care. There were **137** 

child victims of substantiated abuse.<sup>4</sup> There were **137** incidents of adult abuse.<sup>5</sup>

#### As a result of participation in Whitley County Extension programs:<sup>1</sup>

- **252** people increased their knowledge and skills related to parenting and personal relationships.
- **280** adult or child care providers increased their knowledge and skills related to age appropriate care.
- **280** adults and youth improved practical living skills.
