

Figure 1. Population by Age Group² (n=7,065)


► 2008 estimates from the 2000 U.S. Census reported total population as **7,065**.² The graph on the right indicates the percentage by age group.



SPOTLIGHT ON...

MAKING BENEFICIAL LIFESTYLE CHOICES

Kentucky Home Place, Wolfe County Diabetes Coalition, and Wolfe County Extension Service conducted programs through the year to prevent and manage diabetes. One hundred diabetics attended Diabetes Morning, which presented information on healthy eating, portion control, reading a recipe, and foot care. The Kentucky River Medical Center gave free blood pressure and glucose checks; a local pharmacy gave out free meters. All participants took advantage of an opportunity to order diabetic shoes—one hundred pairs were ordered at a total savings of \$3000. In ongoing efforts to raise awareness of diabetes, County Extension and the Diabetes Coalition sponsor a monthly support group, a 5K run/walk during Homecoming, and cooking schools.¹



OUR COMMUNITY

► Unemployment rates are a key economic indicator. In July 2010, the rate of unemployment in Wolfe County was **14.0%**.⁶

Mortgage and bank card delinquency rates and foreclosure filings are important financial indicators of community well-being. In Wolfe County, **1.2%** of mortgages are 90-days delinquent and **2.4%** of bank cards are 60-days delinquent.⁷ In a one-year period (August 2009 through August 2010), **2** foreclosures were filed.⁵


Access to health insurance is another important factor contributing to family well-being. In Wolfe County, **21%** of the people under age 65 are uninsured.⁸

As a result of participation in Wolfe County Extension programs:¹

- **76** people were involved in addressing issues of their community.
- **30** people increased their knowledge of governmental process.
- **14** people were prepared to enter the work force.
- Wolfe County Extension is involved in **11** community coalitions.

OUR HEALTH

► The health of our people contributes to quality of life. The chart below illustrates health risks of adults in Wolfe County. **Figure 2. Health Risks.**⁸



As a result of participation in Wolfe County Extension programs:¹

- **156** people increased knowledge of practices to maintain health and well-being.
- **199** people increased knowledge of safe practices to store, handle, and prepare food.
- **212** people increased their use of radon testers, smoke detectors, fire extinguishers, and other devices to ensure personal safety.

OUR FAMILIES

► Using data from the 2000 U.S. Census, Wolfe County families can be described as follows:²

- **1,977** families reside in the county.
- **610** families (**29.9%**) live below poverty level.
- Median family income is **\$23,333**.
- **41** grandparents are responsible for the care of their grandchildren.



According to the Kentucky Cabinet for Health and Family Services, **1,378** people in Wolfe County receive supplemental nutrition assistance. The average family benefit is **\$218.18** per month.³

In the county, **22** children live in out-of-home care. There were **35**

child victims of substantiated abuse.⁴ There were **11** incidents of adult abuse.⁵

As a result of participation in Wolfe County Extension programs:¹

- **317** adults and youth improved their ability to make informed and effective decisions.
- **219** people adopted money management practices to reduce debt and/or increase savings.
- **312** adults and youth improved practical living skills.
