### **OUR FOCUS**


Family and Consumer Sciences

# EMPOWERING COMMUNITY LEADERS

hat do Boone County Extension Homemakers do best?
Lead, serve, and share. BCEHA celebrated its 75th anniversary this year, offering leader-led projects, fundraisers, and classes that enabled members to log over 25,000 volunteer hours valued at approximately \$534,000. Each year, funds are raised to support projects that include baby blankets for premature infants, cancer-care caps, lap quilts, walker bags, seatbelt pillows, and food/personal products donations. According to the American Cancer Society local chapter, in 2010 there were 1,150 individuals served as a result of efforts by BCEH. The VA Hospital received 1,084 items totaling \$3,289 in value. Local food pantries received 365 cereal boxes. Homemaker leaders taught thirty-five classes this year, and four scholarships totaling \$3,500 were awarded to students.



#### **OUR FAMILIES**

According to the 2010 Census,<sup>1</sup> of families in Boone County with their own children...

- 74.9% are husband-wife families
- 25.1% are single parent families

#### In addition, there are:

- **43,216** households
- 17,483 households with 1 or more persons under the age of 18
- 1,901 grandchildren under 18 years old who live with a grandparent householder
- **8,273** households with at least one person age 65 and over



### As a result of participation in Boone County Extension programs:<sup>2</sup>

- **342** people increased knowledge of lifestyle changes to improve personal health.
- 70 people increased knowledge of parenting and personal relationships.
- **189** people increased knowledge of safe storage, handling and food preparation.

### **OUR COMMUNITY**

In 2009, the most recent data available, the median household income in Boone County was \$67,994.<sup>3</sup>

The number of children in poverty in Boone County was **3,410** compared to **2,515** in 2006.<sup>3</sup>

The total number of people receiving Supplemental Nutrition Assistance Program (SNAP) benefits in Boone County is **10,664** in 2011.<sup>4</sup>

### As a result of participation in Boone County Extension programs:<sup>2</sup>

- **731** people increased leadership knowledge and skills.
- 971 people improved communication skills to address community issues.
- 215 people developed skills to access affordable food.

### **OUR ECONOMY**

According to the 2010 American Community Survey 5-year estimates, between 2005 and 2009 in Boone County it is estimated that...


- **62.3%** (+/- **1.8**) are married-couple families with both husband and wife in the labor force
- **69.4%** (+/- **4.2**) are children under 6 years old with all parents in the labor force
- **6.7%** (+/- **2.1**) are people 65 years and over below poverty level during the past 12 months

## As a result of participation in Boone County Extension programs:<sup>2</sup>

- 484 people increased knowledge of economic and enterprise development.
- **516** people adopted money management practices to reduce debt and increase savings.
- **1,384** people demonstrated increased practical living skills.
