### **OUR FOCUS**


Family and Consumer Sciences Extension is committed to improving the quality of life for individuals and families in Edmonson County. As the current economic situation continues to create challenges, educational programs focus on:

## MAKING HEALTHY LIFESTYLE CHOICES

ccording to Centers for Disease Control and Prevention, Kentucky has the fifth highest national obesity rate, with 35% of children aged 2-5 overweight or at risk of being overweight. To address this problem Edmonson County Cooperative Extension Service offered "LEAP into Health," a collaboration between Extension and organizations, which targeted participants of the public library's summer reading program. In each of eight booths, a book was read that encouraged children to eat healthy or be physically active. At each station the children could taste test fruits and vegetables and play active games. After the program, 94% of the children stated they would eat a variety of food, and 83% would try new foods. 100% would plan to play outside for 30 minutes a day.



#### **OUR FAMILIES**

According to the 2010 Census,<sup>1</sup> of families in Edmonson County with their own children...

- 73.9% are husband-wife families
- 26.1% are single parent families

#### In addition, there are:

- 4,857 households
- 1,518 households with 1 or more persons under the age of 18
- 246 grandchildren under 18 years old who live with a grandparent householder
- 1,471 households with at least one person age 65 and over



## As a result of participation in Edmonson County Extension programs:<sup>2</sup>

- 1,092 people increased knowledge of lifestyle changes to improve personal health.
- 150 people increased knowledge of parenting and personal relationships.
- **391** people increased knowledge of safe storage, handling and food preparation.

## **OUR COMMUNITY**

In 2009, the most recent data available, the median household income in Edmonson County was \$33,550.3

The number of children in poverty in Edmonson County was **732** compared to **725** in 2006.<sup>3</sup>

The total number of people receiving Supplemental Nutrition Assistance Program (SNAP) benefits in Edmonson County is **2,560** in 2011.<sup>4</sup>

## As a result of participation in Edmonson County Extension programs:<sup>2</sup>

- **105** people increased leadership knowledge and skills.
- **150** people improved communication skills to address community issues.
- 402 people developed skills to access affordable food.

### **OUR ECONOMY**

According to the 2010 American Community Survey 5-year estimates, between 2005 and 2009 in Edmonson County it is estimated that...


- **45.4**% (+/- **6.5**) are married-couple families with both husband and wife in the labor force
- **56.8%** (+/- **16.3**) are children under 6 years old with all parents in the labor force
- 22.7% (+/- 6.5) are people 65 years and over below poverty level during the past 12 months

## As a result of participation in Edmonson County Extension programs:<sup>2</sup>

- 22 people increased knowledge of economic and enterprise development.
- 309 people adopted money management practices to reduce debt and increase savings.
- 1,092 people demonstrated increased practical living skills.
