### **OUR FOCUS**


Family and Consumer Sciences

## MAKING HEALTHY LIFESTYLE CHOICES

he growing child obesity rate indicates that emphasizing healthy food choices is critical for the health of our youth. To address this need the Hardin County's Family and Consumer Sciences Extension Staff offered "SuperStar Chef Goes to Farmers Market Camp". This four-day camp, taught 21 children, ages 9 to 12, basic knife skills, food selection, hands-on cooking, and local food sources. The campers went to the local farmers market, where a scavenger hunt got them talking to farmers and vendors. When the kids were asked what they will use after camp, 42% said "knife skills," while 25% said "recipes." Vendors at the market said it was great to see kids eager to learn and try fruits and vegetables.



#### **OUR FAMILIES**

According to the 2010 Census,<sup>1</sup> of families in Hardin County with their own children...

- 68.5% are husband-wife families
- 31.5% are single parent families

#### In addition, there are:

- **39,853** households
- 14,811 households with 1 or more persons under the age of 18
- 2,031 grandchildren under 18 years old who live with a grandparent householder
- **8,390** households with at least one person age 65 and over



## As a result of participation in Hardin County Extension programs:<sup>2</sup>

- **760** people increased knowledge of lifestyle changes to improve personal health.
- **50** people increased knowledge of parenting and personal relationships.
- **680** people increased knowledge of safe storage, handling and food preparation.

## **OUR COMMUNITY**

In 2009, the most recent data available, the median household income in Hardin County was \$45,358.<sup>3</sup>

The number of children in poverty in Hardin County was **5,437** compared to **4,334** in 2006.<sup>3</sup>

The total number of people receiving Supplemental Nutrition Assistance Program (SNAP) benefits in Hardin County is **14,160** in 2011.<sup>4</sup>

## As a result of participation in Hardin County Extension programs:<sup>2</sup>

- **264** people increased leadership knowledge and skills.
- 237 people improved communication skills to address community issues.
- **167** people developed skills to access affordable food.

### **OUR ECONOMY**

According to the 2010 American Community Survey 5-year estimates, between 2005 and 2009 in Hardin County it is estimated that...


- 51% (+/- 2.1) are married-couple families with both husband and wife in the labor force
- **61.7%** (+/- **5.7**) are children under 6 years old with all parents in the labor force
- **8.4%** (+/- **1.8**) are people 65 years and over below poverty level during the past 12 months

## As a result of participation in Hardin County Extension programs:<sup>2</sup>

- **80** people increased knowledge of economic and enterprise development.
- 490 people adopted money management practices to reduce debt and increase savings.
- **867** people demonstrated increased practical living skills.
