
Family and Consumer Sciences

EMPOWERING COMMUNITY LEADERS

enry County Extension Homemakers held the 18th annual holiday bazaar, an outlet for local arts, crafts, and small businesspeople. With 35 booths and a waiting list, the bazaar captures holiday dollars before they leave the county for the malls of our neighbors. Nonprofits also have the opportunity raise funds, with seniors reporting the bazaar as the largest fund-raising opportunity. Through reports from participants, we estimate the bazaar keeps over \$15,000 in shopping dollars in the county. Participants said: "The holiday bazaar helps not only the person renting the booth but the community as well." "It extends the farmers market season." "The crowd was good and steady all day long with buyers, even in this crazy economy."



OUR FAMILIES

According to the 2010 Census,¹ of families in Henry County with their own children...

- 67.5% are husband-wife families
- 32.5% are single parent families

In addition, there are:

- 5,963 households
- 2,037 households with 1 or more persons under the age of 18
- 377 grandchildren under 18 years old who live with a grandparent householder
- **1,593** households with at least one person age 65 and over



As a result of participation in Henry County Extension programs:²

- **380** people increased knowledge of lifestyle changes to improve personal health.
- **34** people increased their awareness of potential health risks associated with exposure to hazardous chemicals.
- **45** people increased knowledge of safe storage, handling and food preparation.

OUR COMMUNITY

In 2009, the most recent data available, the median household income in Henry County was \$42,733.³

The number of children in poverty in Henry County was **879** compared to **765** in 2006.³

The total number of people receiving Supplemental Nutrition Assistance Program (SNAP) benefits in Henry County is **2,774** in 2011.⁴

As a result of participation in Henry County Extension programs:²

- 91 people increased leadership knowledge and skills.
- **46** people were involved in addressing issues of their community.
- 25 people developed skills to access affordable food.

OUR ECONOMY

According to the 2010 American Community Survey 5-year estimates,⁶ between 2005 and 2009 in Henry County it is estimated that...


- **49.7**% (+/- **5.3**) are married-couple families with both husband and wife in the labor force
- 64.2% (+/- 10.2) are children under 6 years old with all parents in the labor force
- 11.6% (+/- 3.9) are people 65 years and over below poverty level during the past 12 months

As a result of participation in Henry County Extension programs:²

- 7 people increased knowledge of economic and enterprise development.
- 350 adults and youth improved their ability to make informed and effective decisions.
- **410** people demonstrated increased practical living skills.
