

SPOTLIGHT ON ...

ACTIVITY MATTERS!

s a community partner in a Carole White grant, the Bullitt County Cooperative Extension agent for Family and Consumer Sciences organized several programs throughout the year at Brooks Elementary School addressing healthy lifestyle choices. Six nutritional education classes were offered to 783 school staff and parents. A physical activity competition was conducted among 20 school staff, who logged 4,199,594 steps over a 45-day period. The winner averaged 19,205 steps a day as she prepared food for the

children. More than 150 people attended a family fun night to participate in a physical activity challenge. In a community struggling with obesity, physical activity programs such as these make an incremental change in the sedentary behaviors of both youth and adults.





OUR FAMILIES

According to the 2010 American Community Survey,³ between 2006 and 2010 it is estimated that in Bullitt County:

- 10.1% (+/- 1.9) families with related children were below poverty
- **8.0%** (+/- **2.3**) of those over the age of 65 were below poverty

In addition:

- 17.9% (+/- 1.6) of those ages 18-64 did not have health insurance in 20104
- 1,017 children on average received Kentucky Children's Health Insurance Program (KCHIP) benefits in 2010⁵
- 9,967 people received Supplemental Nutrition Assistance Program (SNAP) benefits in 2012⁶

As a result of participating in **Bullitt County Extension programs:**²

- 274 people reported spending time in physical activity.
- 342 people increased their knowledge about healthy foods.
- 159 people reported eating more healthy foods.

OUR COMMUNITY

In Bullitt County:

- 75.0% of births were to mothers who received early and regular prenatal care in 2009⁷
- 60.0% of ordered child support was collected in 20118

Of the **21** primary care physicians in Bullitt County:⁹

- 61.9% are family practice
- 4.8% are pediatricians
- 0.0% are OB/GYN

As a result of participating in **Bullitt County Extension programs:**²

- 257 people in Plate it Up! Kentucky Proud indicated they are more likely to buy Kentucky produce.
- 190 people in Plate it Up! Kentucky Proud consumed more vegetables after completing the program.
- 141 people were able to utilize new decisionmaking skills for health.

OUR HEALTH


According to Kentucky Health Facts, 10 between 2008 and 2010 in Bullitt County:

- 19.3% (12.3 29) did not pursue health care due to cost, compared to 18% (17.0 - 18.6) in the state
- 23.1% (16.0 32.2) of adults reported their health status as less than good, compared to 23% (22.0 **- 23.6)** in the state
- 32.5% (24.5 41.6) of adults reported having received a flu vaccine in the past year

As a result of participating in **Bullitt County Extension** programs:²

- 1,196 people increased knowledge of diet and exercise changes to improve health.
- 470 people made diet or exercise changes to improve health.
- 252 people experienced a change in knowledge of healthy home practices and stress management.
