OUR FOCUS

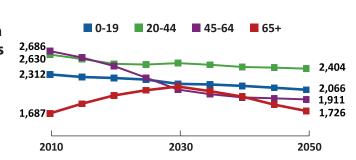
Family and Consumer Sciences Extension is committed to improving the health and well-being of individuals and families in Crittenden County. To help families make wise decisions our educational programs focus on:

MAKING HEALTHY LIFESTYLE CHOICES

iabetes affects many people, and the CDC estimates that in Crittenden County 9.3 percent of adults have been diagnosed with the disease (2008). Following a 12-week diabetes education course last year, participants asked to form a diabetes support group. In partnership with the district health department the group has met monthly at the Crittenden County Cooperative Extension Office, averaging eight to 10 participants. Each month an educational lesson is presented, along with time for sharing. Post

program surveys revealed that 100 percent of participants are now setting and accomplishing goals related to diabetes management. Additionally, 88 percent felt in control of their diabetes after participating. Due to the interest in diabetes in Crittenden County, a Diabetes Coalition was established to seek out grants to assist with diabetes awareness.





OUR FAMILIES

According to the 2010 American Community Survey,³ between 2006 and 2010 it is estimated that in Crittenden County:

- 21.1% (+/- 9.4) families with related children were below poverty
- 17.5% (+/- 6.8) of those over the age of 65 were below poverty

In addition:

- 25.4% (+/- 2.4) of those ages 18-64 did not have health insurance in 2010⁴
- 143 children on average received Kentucky Children's Health Insurance Program (KCHIP) benefits in 2010⁵
- 1,353 people received Supplemental Nutrition Assistance Program (SNAP) benefits in 2012⁶

As a result of participating in Crittenden County Extension programs:²

- 98 people reported spending time in physical activity.
- 200 people increased their knowledge about healthy foods.
- 102 people reported eating more healthy foods.

OUR COMMUNITY

In Crittenden County:

- 7.0% of births were to mothers who received early and regular prenatal care in 2009⁷
- 73.0% of ordered child support was collected in 20118

Of the **5** primary care physicians in Crittenden County:⁹

- 100.0% are family practice
- 0.0% are pediatricians
- 0.0% are OB/GYN

As a result of participating in **Crittenden County Extension programs:**²

- **86** people are involved in addressing community
- 76 people increased awareness of how to manage current economic events.
- 472 people were able to utilize new decisionmaking skills for health.



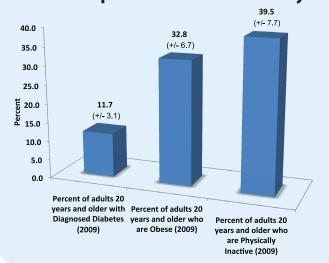
According to Kentucky Health Facts, 10 between 2008 and 2010 in Crittenden County:

- 11.1% (5.3 21.7) did not pursue health care due to cost, compared to 18% (17.0 - 18.6) in the state
- 31.9% (20.3 46.4) of adults reported their health status as less than good, compared to **23% (22.0 - 23.6)** in the state
- 28.8% (19.3 40.7) of adults reported having received a flu vaccine in the past year

As a result of participating in **Crittenden County Extension** programs:²

- 180 people increased knowledge of diet and exercise changes to improve health.
- 226 people in Plate it Up! Kentucky Proud indicated they are more likely to buy Kentucky produce.
- 180 people experienced a change in knowledge of healthy home practices and stress management.
