

SPOTLIGHT ON ...

TAKING OWNERSHIP OF DIABETES

n Hardin County, roughly 7.8 percent of the population has been diagnosed with diabetes. In an effort to educate those diagnosed with the disease, as well as their caregivers, the Hardin County Cooperative Extension Service and Lincoln Trail Area Health Department worked together to conduct a four-part diabetes management program. Over the four-week period, 13 people attended the program, the majority of which were already diagnosed with diabetes. A few participants attended because they have a

spouse who has been diagnosed with diabetes or were interested in learning more about it. At the conclusion of the program, 84.6 percent of participants reported an increase in compliance with their prescribed diet, progress in their goal setting, and accomplishing one or more goals in relation to their diabetes.





OUR FAMILIES

According to the 2010 American Community Survey,³ between 2006 and 2010 it is estimated that in Hardin County:

- 16.0% (+/- 2.3) families with related children were below poverty
- 7.7% (+/- 2.1) of those over the age of 65 were below poverty

In addition:

- 18.4% (+/- 1.6) of those ages 18-64 did not have health insurance in 2010⁴
- 1,385 children on average received Kentucky Children's Health Insurance Program (KCHIP) benefits in 2010⁵
- 14,969 people received Supplemental Nutrition Assistance Program (SNAP) benefits in 2012⁶

As a result of participating in Hardin County Extension programs:²

- 200 people reported spending time in physical activity.
- 1,000 people increased their knowledge about healthy foods.
- 200 people reported eating more healthy foods.

OUR COMMUNITY

In Hardin County:

- 51.0% of births were to mothers who received early and regular prenatal care in 2009⁷
- 65.0% of ordered child support was collected in 2011 8

Of the **79** primary care physicians in Hardin County:⁹

- 31.6% are family practice
- 24.1% are pediatricians
- 12.7% are OB/GYN

As a result of participating in Hardin County Extension programs:²

- 31 people are involved in addressing community
- 833 people increased awareness of how to manage current economic events.
- 1,083 people were able to utilize new decisionmaking skills for health.

OUR HEALTH


According to Kentucky Health Facts, 10 between 2008 and 2010 in Hardin County:

- 15.1% (10.6 21) did not pursue health care due to cost, compared to 18% (17.0 - 18.6) in the state
- 19.9% (15.6 25.0) of adults reported their health status as less than good, compared to 23% (22.0 **- 23.6)** in the state
- 45.7% (39.9 51.5) of adults reported having received a flu vaccine in the past year

As a result of participating in **Hardin County Extension** programs:²

- 500 people increased knowledge of diet and exercise changes to improve health.
- 508 people in Plate it Up! Kentucky Proud indicated they are more likely to buy Kentucky produce.
- 100 people experienced a change in knowledge of healthy home practices and stress management.
