

# **SPOTLIGHT ON ...**

# **HEART HEALTHY HENDERSON**

ardiovascular disease is the leading cause of death in Kentucky, which ranks 11th highest in the nation for heart disease mortality. During Heart Awareness Month, the Henderson County Cooperative Extension Service collaborated with local organizations to increase women's awareness of heart disease through a program called Shades of Red. Over the past three years, 396 program participants have learned the risks and symptoms of heart disease. One woman who attended was able to recognize months later

that her daughter was having a heart attack. Her quick response led to care that saved her daughter's life. Post program evaluations reported 95 percent of participants had been inspired to change health behaviors and plan to take better care of their own heart health and 90 percent are getting regular checkups.





#### **OUR FAMILIES**

According to the 2010 American Community Survey,<sup>3</sup> between 2006 and 2010 it is estimated that in **Henderson County:** 

- 20.4% (+/- 3.2) families with related children were below poverty
- 9.9% (+/- 2.4) of those over the age of 65 were below poverty

#### In addition:

- 18.6% (+/- 1.7) of those ages 18-64 did not have health insurance in 20104
- 722 children on average received Kentucky Children's Health Insurance Program (KCHIP) benefits in 2010<sup>5</sup>
- 8,616 people received Supplemental Nutrition Assistance Program (SNAP) benefits in 2012<sup>6</sup>

#### As a result of participating in Henderson County Extension programs:<sup>2</sup>

- 350 people reported spending time in physical activity.
- 301 people increased their knowledge about healthy foods.
- 63 people reported eating more healthy foods.

# **OUR COMMUNITY**

#### In Henderson County:

- 51.0% of births were to mothers who received early and regular prenatal care in 2009<sup>7</sup>
- 59.0% of ordered child support was collected in 20118

Of the **43** primary care physicians in Henderson County: <sup>9</sup>

- 53.5% are family practice
- 14.0% are pediatricians
- 11.6% are OB/GYN

### As a result of participating in Henderson County Extension programs:<sup>2</sup>

- 73 people are involved in addressing community
- 100 people implemented personal health protection practices.
- 750 people were able to utilize new decisionmaking skills for health.

# **OUR HEALTH**


According to Kentucky Health Facts, 10 between 2008 and 2010 in Henderson County:

- 17.1% (11.9 23.9) did not pursue health care due to cost, compared to 18% (17.0 - 18.6) in the state
- 24.2% (17.7 32.1) of adults reported their health status as less than good, compared to 23% (22.0 **- 23.6)** in the state
- 46.2% (38.9 53.6) of adults reported having received a flu vaccine in the past year

## As a result of participating in **Henderson County Extension** programs:<sup>2</sup>

- 63 people increased knowledge of diet and exercise changes to improve health.
- **42** people made diet or exercise changes to improve health.
- 25 people experienced a change in knowledge of healthy home practices and stress management.
