OUR FOCUS

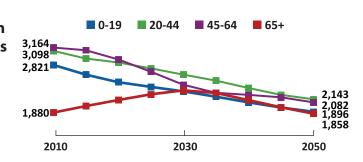
Family and Consumer Sciences Extension is committed to improving the health and well-being of individuals and families in Monroe County. To help families make wise decisions our educational programs focus on:

In 2011-2012, Family and Consumer Sciences Extension made **9,685** contacts with Monroe County individuals and families.²

SPOTLIGHT ON ...

MAKING HEALTHY LIFESTYLE CHOICES

he health and well-being of families and individuals is a top priority of Monroe County Cooperative Extension Service's Family and Consumer Sciences program. Multiple programs to promote healthy lifestyle choices were introduced. In an effort to expose Monroe Countians to healthy recipes made with fresh fruits and vegetables, Plate it Up! Kentucky Proud samples and recipes were distributed at the farmers market each month. Additionally a five-session diabetes educational program was offered in partnership

with several community partners to help participants begin to take ownership of their diabetes. Of those participating, six reported they had set and accomplished one or more goals for themselves during the class and six reported the class helped them to solve problems that come about in daily life in dealing with their diabetes.





OUR FAMILIES

According to the 2010 American Community Survey,³ between 2006 and 2010 it is estimated that in Monroe County:

- 34.8% (+/- 9.4) families with related children were below poverty
- 26.5% (+/- 7.1) of those over the age of 65 were below poverty

In addition:

- 27.3% (+/- 2.6) of those ages 18-64 did not have health insurance in 20104
- 288 children on average received Kentucky Children's Health Insurance Program (KCHIP) benefits in 2010⁵
- 2,919 people received Supplemental Nutrition Assistance Program (SNAP) benefits in 2012⁶

As a result of participating in Monroe County Extension programs:²

- 100 people reported spending time in physical activity.
- 350 people increased their knowledge about healthy foods.
- 350 people reported eating more healthy foods.

OUR COMMUNITY

In Monroe County:

- 50.0% of births were to mothers who received early and regular prenatal care in 2009⁷
- 58.0% of ordered child support was collected in 2011 8

Of the **6** primary care physicians in Monroe County: ⁹

- 66.7% are family practice
- 0.0% are pediatricians
- 0.0% are OB/GYN

As a result of participating in **Monroe County Extension programs:**²

- 250 people reported accessing healthy community food sources such as farmers market or food pantry.
- 461 people made food safety changes to improve health.
- 377 people were able to utilize new decisionmaking skills for health.



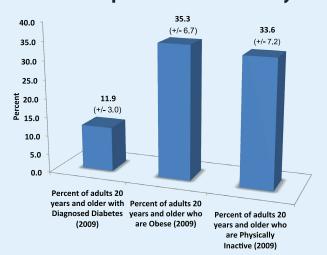
According to Kentucky Health Facts, 10 between 2008 and 2010 in Monroe County:

- 21.6% (12.6 34.5) did not pursue health care due to cost, compared to 18% (17.0 - 18.6) in the state
- 25.5% (16.6 37.1) of adults reported their health status as less than good, compared to 23% (22.0 -**23.6)** in the state
- 38.9% (27.5 51.6) of adults reported having received a flu vaccine in the past year

As a result of participating in **Monroe County Extension** programs:²

- 800 people increased knowledge of diet and exercise changes to improve health.
- 358 people made diet or exercise changes to improve health.
- 312 people experienced a change in knowledge of healthy home practices and stress management.
