

SPOTLIGHT ON ...

MONTGOMERY IN MOTION

he Center for Disease Control lists Kentucky as one of the least active states. This inactivity contributes to a number of health problems. To combat these problems, the Montgomery County Cooperative Extension Service organized Montgomery In Motion Coalition. Through the coalition \$97,900 was secured to pave a new walking and biking trail downtown Mt. Sterling. As part of the

dedication of the new trail, a physical activity day was held with 125 students attending and exercising during group activities. Mayor Gary Williamson says, "the Adena Trail is an important addition to our community's built environment and adds to the opportunities for families to exercise together to promote better health and stronger families."





OUR FAMILIES

According to the 2010 American Community Survey,³ between 2006 and 2010 it is estimated that in Montgomery County:

- 26.5% (+/- 5.2) families with related children were below poverty
- 16.8% (+/- 4.2) of those over the age of 65 were below poverty

In addition:

- 21.7% (+/- 2.1) of those ages 18-64 did not have health insurance in 20104
- 516 children on average received Kentucky Children's Health Insurance Program (KCHIP) benefits in 2010⁵
- 6,329 people received Supplemental Nutrition Assistance Program (SNAP) benefits in 2012⁶

As a result of participating in **Montgomery County Extension programs:**²

- 103 people reported spending time in physical activity.
- 7,500 people increased their knowledge about healthy foods.
- 420 people reported eating more healthy foods.

OUR COMMUNITY

In Montgomery County:

- 77.0% of births were to mothers who received early and regular prenatal care in 2009⁷
- 53.0% of ordered child support was collected in 20118

Of the **18** primary care physicians in Montgomery County:⁹

- 33.3% are family practice
- 5.6% are pediatricians
- 11.1% are OB/GYN

As a result of participating in **Montgomery County Extension programs:**²

- 246 people are involved in addressing community
- 428 people increased awareness of how to manage current economic events.
- 734 people were able to utilize new decisionmaking skills for health.




According to Kentucky Health Facts, 10 between 2008 and 2010 in Montgomery County:

- 13.3% (9.3 18.6) did not pursue health care due to cost, compared to 18% (17.0 - 18.6) in the state
- 24.7% (19.7 30.4) of adults reported their health status as less than good, compared to 23% (22.0 - 23.6) in the state
- 54.1% (47.1 61.0) of adults reported having received a flu vaccine in the past year

As a result of participating in **Montgomery County Extension** programs:²

- 660 people increased knowledge of diet and exercise changes to improve health.
- **753** people made diet or exercise changes to improve health.
- 81 people experienced a change in knowledge of healthy home practices and stress management.
