
OUR FOCUS

SPOTLIGHT ON ...

TORNADO RELIEF

n February 28 an EF-1 tornado touched down in Morgan County, followed by an EF-3 tornado on March 2. In the wake of the destruction, 299 homes were destroyed, and six community members lost their lives.

The Morgan County Cooperative Extension Service collaborated with other agencies to provide assistance to the victims, including serving 14,000 meals, educating relief centers about food safety to protect families from food-borne illnesses, procuring and coordinating supplies between stations, assisting with distribution of food safety

information, cleaning materials, and organization of donations at relief centers.

Clientele commented, "We didn't know the Morgan County Extension Office was destroyed because we saw all of you working." Long term recovery efforts will continue for a long time.





OUR FAMILIES

According to the 2010 American Community Survey,³ between 2006 and 2010 it is estimated that in Morgan County:

- 28.7% (+/- 8.3) families with related children were below poverty
- 12.3% (+/- 4.4) of those over the age of 65 were below poverty

In addition:

- 26.8% (+/- 2.7) of those ages 18-64 did not have health insurance in 2010⁴
- 306 children on average received Kentucky Children's Health Insurance Program (KCHIP) benefits in 2010⁵
- 3,586 people received Supplemental Nutrition Assistance Program (SNAP) benefits in 2012⁶

As a result of participating in Morgan County Extension programs:²

- 128 people reported spending time in physical activity.
- 712 people increased their knowledge about healthy foods.
- 322 people reported eating more healthy foods.

OUR COMMUNITY

In Morgan County:

- 58.0% of births were to mothers who received early and regular prenatal care in 2009⁷
- 72.0% of ordered child support was collected in 2011 8

Of the **8** primary care physicians in Morgan County:⁹

- 62.5% are family practice
- 0.0% are pediatricians
- 0.0% are OB/GYN

As a result of participating in Morgan County Extension programs:²

- 205 people are involved in addressing community
- 342 people increased awareness of how to manage current economic events.
- 800 people were able to utilize new decisionmaking skills for health.

OUR HEALTH


According to Kentucky Health Facts, 10 between 2008 and 2010 in Morgan County:

- 34.8% (27.3 43.1) did not pursue health care due to cost, compared to 18% (17.0 - 18.6) in the state
- 27.8% (21.9 34.6) of adults reported their health status as less than good, compared to 23% (22.0 -**23.6)** in the state
- 30.0% (23.9 37.0) of adults reported having received a flu vaccine in the past year

As a result of participating in **Morgan County Extension** programs:²

- 969 people increased knowledge of diet and exercise changes to improve health.
- 335 people made diet or exercise changes to improve health.
- 217 people in Taking Ownership of Your Diabetes utilized a diabetes meal plan.
