#### **OUR FOCUS**


Family and Consumer Sciences

# WEIGHT THE REALITY SERIES

n Nelson County, almost 30 percent of the adult population is considered obese. To combat the problem, the Nelson County Cooperative Extension Service's Family and Consumer Sciences agent offered a weight loss competition using the Weight: The Reality Series curriculum. A local gym owner came and spoke to the group about



proper ways to exercise as well. Over 40 people signed up for the program initially and more than 50 percent were still active when the competition ended. Of the program completers, more than 90 percent reported that they had made changes to their everyday lifestyle because of the information presented. Ninety-eight percent had lost or maintained their weight since the beginning weigh-in. Throughout the course of the competition, more than 200 pounds were lost.



#### **OUR FAMILIES**

According to the 2010 American Community Survey,<sup>3</sup> between 2006 and 2010 it is estimated that in **Nelson County:** 

- 17.5% (+/- 4.0) families with related children were below poverty
- 14.6% (+/- 5.7) of those over the age of 65 were below poverty

#### In addition:

- 18.9% (+/- 1.8) of those ages 18-64 did not have health insurance in 2010<sup>4</sup>
- 644 children on average received Kentucky Children's Health Insurance Program (KCHIP) benefits in 2010<sup>5</sup>
- 7,217 people received Supplemental Nutrition Assistance Program (SNAP) benefits in 2012<sup>6</sup>

#### As a result of participating in **Nelson County Extension programs:**<sup>2</sup>

- 1,180 people were reached with the importance of physical activity.
- 671 people increased their knowledge about healthy foods.
- 200 people reported eating more healthy foods.

#### **OUR COMMUNITY**

#### In Nelson County:

- 74.0% of births were to mothers who received early and regular prenatal care in 2009<sup>7</sup>
- 60.0% of ordered child support was collected in 20118

Of the **30** primary care physicians in Nelson County:<sup>9</sup>

- 43.3% are family practice
- 26.7% are pediatricians
- 10.0% are OB/GYN

#### As a result of participating in **Nelson County Extension programs:**<sup>2</sup>

- 210 people experienced a change in knowledge of healthy food safety practices.
- 100 people in Plate it Up! Kentucky Proud indicated they are more likely to buy Kentucky produce.
- 2,664 people were able to utilize new decisionmaking skills for health.

# **OUR HEALTH**


According to Kentucky Health Facts, 10 between 2008 and 2010 in Nelson County:

- 18.8% (12.0 28.1) did not pursue health care due to cost, compared to 18% (17.0 - 18.6) in the state
- 17.1% (11.5 24.5) of adults reported their health status as less than good, compared to 23% (22.0 -**23.6)** in the state
- 37.0% (28.9 45.9) of adults reported having received a flu vaccine in the past year

#### As a result of participating in **Nelson County Extension** programs:<sup>2</sup>

- 500 people increased knowledge of diet and exercise changes to improve health.
- 82 people made diet or exercise changes to improve health.
- 95 people experienced a change in knowledge of healthy home practices and stress management.
