

SPOTLIGHT ON ...

KIDS COOKING CAMP

ids' Cooking Camp — a collaborative effort between the Oldham County Cooperative Extension Service and the Oldham County Health Department — was established to address the growing concern for childhood obesity. Kids' Cooking Camp addressed the importance of following the "MyPlate Food Guide" recommendations to promote healthy eating habits and more physical activities for playtime. The goal of the camp is to teach young people healthy habits to share with their family members. Each day, the 25 participants prepared different courses for a celebration meal on the

fourth day. Reading and following recipe directions was stressed with each daily lesson. Open response surveys revealed that 95 percent of participants realize the importance of following a recipe and they could identify the healthy choices of the "MyPlate Food Guide".





OUR FAMILIES

According to the 2010 American Community Survey,³ between 2006 and 2010 it is estimated that in Oldham County:

- 8.1% (+/- 1.7) families with related children were below poverty
- 9.0% (+/- 5.6) of those over the age of 65 were below poverty

In addition:

- 12.1% (+/- 1.2) of those ages 18-64 did not have health insurance in 20104
- 517 children on average received Kentucky Children's Health Insurance Program (KCHIP) benefits in 2010⁵
- 2,730 people received Supplemental Nutrition Assistance Program (SNAP) benefits in 2012⁶

As a result of participating in Oldham County Extension programs:²

- 275 people reported spending time in physical activity.
- 6,065 people increased their knowledge about healthy foods.
- 5,505 people reported eating more healthy foods.

OUR COMMUNITY

In Oldham County:

- 77.0% of births were to mothers who received early and regular prenatal care in 2009⁷
- 68.0% of ordered child support was collected in 20118

Of the 32 primary care physicians in Oldham County:9

- 28.1% are family practice
- 18.8% are pediatricians
- 12.5% are OB/GYN

As a result of participating in Oldham County Extension programs:²

- 410 people are involved in addressing community
- 400 people in Plate it Up! Kentucky Proud indicated they are more likely to buy Kentucky produce.
- 325 people were able to utilize new decisionmaking skills for health.



OUR HEALTH


According to Kentucky Health Facts, 10 between 2008 and 2010 in Oldham County:

- **6.3%** (**3.4 11.6**) did not pursue health care due to cost, compared to 18% (17.0 - 18.6) in the state
- **8.0%** (**4.2 14.6**) of adults reported their health status as less than good, compared to 23% (22.0 **- 23.6)** in the state
- 44.2% (32.4 56.7) of adults reported having received a flu vaccine in the past year

As a result of participating in **Oldham County Extension** programs:²

- 6,035 people increased knowledge of diet and exercise changes to improve health.
- 1,700 people made diet or exercise changes to improve health.
- 375 people experienced a change in knowledge of healthy home practices and stress management.
