Family and Consumer Sciences Extension is committed to improving the health and well-being of individuals and families in Perry County. To help families make wise decisions our educational programs focus on:

- Embracing Life as We Age to strive for independence longer
- Securing Financial Stability in a turbulent economic period

In 2011-2012, Family and Consumer Sciences Extension made **20,794** contacts with Perry County individuals and families.²



SPOTLIGHT ON ...

HEALTHY MOTHERS, HEALTHY BABIES

hen an expectant mother receives proper nutrition and is healthy overall, she is likely to have a smoother pregnancy and a healthier baby. Spreading this message was the goal behind two baby fairs held in June 2012. The first was held in Hazard, primarily reaching expectant moms, moms of infants up to 2 years old, and caregivers from Perry and Leslie counties. The second was held in Whitesburg for the same target groups but this time from

Letcher County. Fifteen agencies participated with Cooperative Extension Service agents, providing free information and publications on how they can support the mothers and families of young children. A total of 85 mothers and expectant mothers participated, along with some fathers and caregivers.





OUR FAMILIES

According to the 2010 American Community Survey,³ between 2006 and 2010 it is estimated that in Perry County:

- **39.9% (+/- 6.6)** families with related children were below poverty
- **19.0% (+/- 4.7)** of those over the age of 65 were below poverty

In addition:

- 22.9% (+/- 2.1) of those ages 18-64 did not have health insurance in 2010⁴
- **661** children on average received Kentucky Children's Health Insurance Program (KCHIP) benefits in 2010⁵
- **10,610** people received Supplemental Nutrition Assistance Program (SNAP) benefits in 2012⁶

As a result of participating in Perry County Extension programs:²

- **805** people increased knowledge of safe storage, handling and food preparation.
- **1,694** people increased their knowledge about healthy foods.
- 769 people reported eating more healthy foods.

OUR COMMUNITY

In Perry County:

- **58.0%** of births were to mothers who received early and regular prenatal care in 2009⁷
- 59.0% of ordered child support was collected in 2011⁸

Of the **45** primary care physicians in Perry County:⁹

- 40.0% are family practice
- **13.3%** are pediatricians
- 2.2% are OB/GYN

As a result of participating in Perry County Extension programs:²

- **805** people experienced a change in knowledge of healthy food safety practices.
- **204** people increased awareness of how to manage current economic events.
- **1,578** people were able to utilize new decisionmaking skills for health.

OUR HEALTH

According to Kentucky Health Facts,¹⁰ between 2008 and 2010 in Perry County:

- 25.4% (19.2 32.9) did not pursue health care due to cost, compared to 18% (17.0 18.6) in the state
- 40.0% (33.4 46.9) of adults reported their health status as less than good, compared to 23% (22.0 23.6) in the state
- **39.5% (33.0 46.3)** of adults reported having received a flu vaccine in the past year

As a result of participating in Perry County Extension programs:²

- **800** people increased knowledge of diet and exercise changes to improve health.
- **105** people implemented personal health protection practices.
- 800 people experienced a change in knowledge of healthy home practices and stress management.
