#### **OUR FOCUS**


Family and Consumer Sciences Extension is committed to improving the health and well-being of individuals and families in Rockcastle County. To help families make wise decisions our educational programs focus on:

# HIGH SCHOOL FRUIT AND VEGETABLE TASTING

o encourage teens to eat healthy, the Rockcastle Cooperative Extension Service staff cooperated with the Practical Living Teacher to host high school taste parties that featured a wide variety of fruits and vegetables during the lunch break. Each Tuesday for five weeks, students in the food preparation class prepared a food item with the main ingredients being either a fruit or vegetable. Then on Wednesday, each of the 800 students were given the opportunity

to taste the food item during their lunch break. Results from surveys and from student responses showed that students preferred fruit dishes over vegetable dishes. The favorite food item for students was fruit salsa. Students were more likely to taste a new food if they had helped to prepare the food item.





#### **OUR FAMILIES**

According to the 2010 American Community Survey,<sup>3</sup> between 2006 and 2010 it is estimated that in **Rockcastle County:** 

- 27.7% (+/- 6.1) families with related children were below poverty
- 29.2% (+/- 6.4) of those over the age of 65 were below poverty

#### In addition:

- 24.1% (+/- 2.3) of those ages 18-64 did not have health insurance in 20104
- 294 children on average received Kentucky Children's Health Insurance Program (KCHIP) benefits in 2010<sup>5</sup>
- 4,832 people received Supplemental Nutrition Assistance Program (SNAP) benefits in 2012<sup>6</sup>

#### As a result of participating in Rockcastle County Extension programs:<sup>2</sup>

- 215 people reported spending time in physical activity.
- 1,610 people increased their knowledge about healthy foods.
- 808 people reported eating more healthy foods.

#### **OUR COMMUNITY**

#### In Rockcastle County:

- 53.0% of births were to mothers who received early and regular prenatal care in 2009<sup>7</sup>
- 53.0% of ordered child support was collected in 2011 8

Of the **10** primary care physicians in Rockcastle County:<sup>9</sup>

- 70.0% are family practice
- 10.0% are pediatricians
- 0.0% are OB/GYN

#### As a result of participating in **Rockcastle County Extension programs:**<sup>2</sup>

- 2,340 people were reached with the importance of physical activity.
- 1,380 people reported accessing healthy community food sources such as farmers market or food pantry.
- 290 people were able to utilize new decisionmaking skills for health.

## **OUR HEALTH**


According to Kentucky Health Facts, 10 between 2008 and 2010 in Rockcastle County:

- 18.9% (10.8 31.0) did not pursue health care due to cost, compared to 18% (17.0 - 18.6) in the state
- 28.1% (20.0 37.9) of adults reported their health status as less than good, compared to 23% (22.0 -**23.6)** in the state
- 29.6% (21.8 38.8) of adults reported having received a flu vaccine in the past year

#### As a result of participating in **Rockcastle County Extension** programs:<sup>2</sup>

- 1,116 people increased knowledge of diet and exercise changes to improve health.
- 200 people reported changing safety practices at home and play.
- 189 people experienced a change in knowledge of healthy home practices and stress management.
