

SPOTLIGHT ON ...

BREAST CANCER AWARENESS

o increase awareness of breast cancer, to promote changes in attitudes, and to teach proactive measures in Russell County, the Cooperative Extension Service teamed up with the Russell County Hospital and the Kentucky Cancer Program to offer a series of educational sessions on breast cancer prevention. The sessions included information on signs, symptoms, risk factors, types of screening, free resources to cover costs of screening and treatment, and the importance of early screening. Free mammograms were offered to women who didn't have a way to cover the costs. In

addition, during Breast Cancer Awareness Month in October Russell County Homemakers received educational information on the topic,10 public service announcements were written and taped with local voices that aired on WHVE radio for one month. Ten women received free mammograms.





OUR FAMILIES

According to the 2010 American Community Survey,³ between 2006 and 2010 it is estimated that in **Russell County:**

- 27.4% (+/- 6.6) families with related children were below poverty
- 24.4% (+/- 5.3) of those over the age of 65 were below poverty

In addition:

- 25.5% (+/- 2.3) of those ages 18-64 did not have health insurance in 2010⁴
- 415 children on average received Kentucky Children's Health Insurance Program (KCHIP) benefits in 2010⁵
- 4,750 people received Supplemental Nutrition Assistance Program (SNAP) benefits in 2012⁶

As a result of participating in Russell County Extension programs:²

- 175 people reported changing safety practices at home and play.
- 250 people increased their knowledge about healthy foods.
- 500 people were reached with the importance of physical activity.

OUR COMMUNITY

In Russell County:

- 71.0% of births were to mothers who received early and regular prenatal care in 2009⁷
- 56.0% of ordered child support was collected in 20118

Of the **12** primary care physicians in Russell County:⁹

- 75.0% are family practice
- 0.0% are pediatricians
- 0.0% are OB/GYN

As a result of participating in Russell County Extension programs:²

- 450 people in Plate it Up! Kentucky Proud indicated they are more likely to buy Kentucky produce.
- 325 people increased awareness of how to manage current economic events.
- 240 people were able to utilize new decisionmaking skills for health.

OUR HEALTH


According to Kentucky Health Facts, 10 between 2008 and 2010 in Russell County:

- 20.2% (13.7 28.8) did not pursue health care due to cost, compared to 18% (17.0 - 18.6) in the state
- 23.9% (17.4 31.9) of adults reported their health status as less than good, compared to 23% (22.0 -**23.6)** in the state
- 40.1% (31.8 49.0) of adults reported having received a flu vaccine in the past year

As a result of participating in **Russell County Extension** programs:²

- 375 people increased knowledge of diet and exercise changes to improve health.
- 125 people made diet or exercise changes to improve health.
- 150 people experienced a change in knowledge of healthy home practices and stress management.
