OUR FOCUS


Family and Consumer Sciences Extension is committed to improving the health and well-being of individuals and families in Spencer County. To help families make wise decisions our educational programs focus on:

KIDS IN THE KITCHEN

entucky ranks sixth out of all 50 states for obesity. To address this issue, the Spencer County Cooperative Extension Service agents for Family and Consumer Sciences and 4-H Youth Development offered programs that focused on basic nutrition and healthy lifestyles. Kids in the Kitchen taught 15 children proper hand washing, basic nutrition, and quick and easy recipes to make at home. The Summer School Enrichment Program involved more than 75 elementary and

middle school children to learn basic nutrition, portion sizes, food groups, and how to grow fruits and vegetables in a windowsill garden. Many voiced that they will continue with their windowsill garden at home, be more aware of their portion sizes, and instruct others on good nutrition.





OUR FAMILIES

According to the 2010 American Community Survey,³ between 2006 and 2010 it is estimated that in **Spencer County:**

- 7.8% (+/- 3.7) families with related children were below poverty
- **8.2%** (+/- **6.3**) of those over the age of 65 were below poverty

In addition:

- 17.1% (+/- 1.7) of those ages 18-64 did not have health insurance in 2010⁴
- 242 children on average received Kentucky Children's Health Insurance Program (KCHIP) benefits in 2010⁵
- 1,881 people received Supplemental Nutrition Assistance Program (SNAP) benefits in 2012⁶

As a result of participating in Spencer County Extension programs:²

- 2,100 people reported spending time in physical activity.
- 5,100 people increased their knowledge about healthy foods.
- 3,300 people reported eating more healthy foods.

OUR COMMUNITY

In Spencer County:

- 80.0% of births were to mothers who received early and regular prenatal care in 2009⁷
- 65.0% of ordered child support was collected in 2011 8

Of the **3** primary care physicians in Spencer County:⁹

- 66.7% are family practice
- 0.0% are pediatricians
- 0.0% are OB/GYN

As a result of participating in **Spencer County Extension programs:**²

- 8,800 people are involved in addressing community issues.
- 1,500 people increased awareness of how to manage current economic events.
- 9,600 people were able to utilize new decisionmaking skills for health.




According to the Kentucky BRFSS, in 2010 in Spencer County's KIPDA Area Development District:10

- 74.6% (68.4 88.7) women age 40 and over had a mammogram in the past two years, compared to 69.9% (67.7 - 72.2) in the state
- **82.3%** (**78.4 86.1**) of adults reported their health as good, compared to 78.5% (77.1 - 79.8) in the state
- 44.6% (39.1 50.1) of adults reported having received a flu vaccine in the past year

As a result of participating in **Spencer County Extension** programs:²

- 4,300 people increased knowledge of diet and exercise changes to improve health.
- 1,600 people made diet or exercise changes to improve health.
- 1,600 people experienced a change in knowledge of healthy home practices and stress management.
