#### **OUR FOCUS**


Family and Consumer Sciences Extension is committed to improving the health and well-being of individuals and families in Union County. To help families make wise decisions our educational programs focus on:

# **BECOMING HEART HEALTHY**

eart disease kills more women than men each year. The disease, largely preventable, kills about 460,000 women a year nationally. The Union County Cooperative Extension Service teamed up with the Union County Health Coalition to increase women's awareness and knowledge of their risk for heart disease through a "Heart Health Lunch and Learn" program. Eighty-four participants heard speakers Vicki O'Nan, a heart attack survivor, and Mary Ann Correll of the Green River District Health Department.

A voluntary exit survey was completed by 73 of the 84 participants. The surveys indicated that because of the information they received from the program, more than 80 percent were willing and motivated to take better care of their hearts. Ninety-eight percent rated the luncheon as an overall success.





#### **OUR FAMILIES**

According to the 2010 American Community Survey,<sup>3</sup> between 2006 and 2010 it is estimated that in Union County:

- 14.3% (+/- 4.1) families with related children were below poverty
- 16.7% (+/- 5.0) of those over the age of 65 were below poverty

#### In addition:

- 20.4% (+/- 2.1) of those ages 18-64 did not have health insurance in 20104
- 217 children on average received Kentucky Children's Health Insurance Program (KCHIP) benefits in 2010<sup>5</sup>
- 2,636 people received Supplemental Nutrition Assistance Program (SNAP) benefits in 2012<sup>6</sup>

#### As a result of participating in Union County Extension programs:<sup>2</sup>

- 50 people in Plate it Up! Kentucky Proud indicated they are more likely to buy Kentucky produce.
- 30 people increased their knowledge about healthy foods.
- 140 people made lifestyle changes to improve health.

#### **OUR COMMUNITY**

#### In Union County:

- 53.0% of births were to mothers who received early and regular prenatal care in 2009<sup>7</sup>
- 66.0% of ordered child support was collected in 20118

Of the **7** primary care physicians in Union County:<sup>9</sup>

- 71.4% are family practice
- 0.0% are pediatricians
- 0.0% are OB/GYN

#### As a result of participating in **Union County Extension programs:**<sup>2</sup>

- 175 people reported changing safety practices at home and play.
- 45 people implemented personal health protection practices.
- 150 people were able to utilize new decisionmaking skills for health.




According to Kentucky Health Facts, 10 between 2008 and 2010 in Union County:

- 22.5% (12.4 37.4) did not pursue health care due to cost, compared to 18% (17.0 - 18.6) in the state
- 22.5% (14.3 33.7) of adults reported their health status as less than good, compared to 23% (22.0 -**23.6)** in the state
- 37.3% (26.8 49.2) of adults reported having received a flu vaccine in the past year

#### As a result of participating in **Union County Extension** programs:<sup>2</sup>

- 380 people increased knowledge of diet and exercise changes to improve health.
- **75** people made diet or exercise changes to improve health.
- 280 people experienced a change in knowledge of healthy home practices and stress management.
