

SPOTLIGHT ON ...

FOOD PRESERVATION OF LOCAL PRODUCE

he instability in the economy and the push toward healthier food choices have increased interest in home food preservation. To assist those in Wolfe County who were interested in learning more about proper food preservation and methods, the Cooperative Extension Service Family and Consumer Sciences agent offered five, three-hour, hands-on workshops on food preservation, water bath canning, pressure canning, freezing, and dehydrating. At each workshop, the agent reviewed safe, up-to-date, research-based practices and worked with participants in using the pressure canner to

preserve green beans, as well as the water-bath canner to preserve grape jelly and dehydrate beef and apples. There were six to 10 participants in each workshop. Only one participant was experienced in food preservation; most of the rest had not preserved food since childhood.





OUR FAMILIES

According to the 2010 American Community Survey,³ between 2006 and 2010 it is estimated that in Wolfe County:

- 55.9% (+/- 14.2) families with related children were below poverty
- 20.8% (+/- 10.8) of those over the age of 65 were below poverty

In addition:

- 23.7% (+/- 2.3) of those ages 18-64 did not have health insurance in 20104
- 161 children on average received Kentucky Children's Health Insurance Program (KCHIP) benefits in 2010⁵
- 3,068 people received Supplemental Nutrition Assistance Program (SNAP) benefits in 2012⁶

As a result of participating in **Wolfe County Extension programs:**²

- 60 people were reached on the importance of physical activity.
- 731 people increased their knowledge about healthy foods.
- 356 people reported eating more healthy foods.

OUR COMMUNITY

In Wolfe County:

- 60.0% of births were to mothers who received early and regular prenatal care in 2009⁷
- 57.0% of ordered child support was collected in 20118

Of the 3 primary care physicians in Wolfe County:9

- 33.3% are family practice
- 0.0% are pediatricians
- 0.0% are OB/GYN

As a result of participating in **Wolfe County Extension programs:**²

- 432 people reported accessing healthy community food sources such as farmers market or food pantry.
- 39 people experienced a change in knowledge of healthy food safety practices.
- 437 people were able to utilize new decisionmaking skills for health.




- 2008 and 2010 in Wolfe County:
- 23.4% (14.2 36.0) did not pursue health care due to cost, compared to 18% (17.0 - 18.6) in the state
- **30.6%** (**21.0 42.1**) of adults reported their health status as less than good, compared to 23% (22.0 -**23.6)** in the state
- 31.1% (21.3 43.0) of adults reported having received a flu vaccine in the past year

As a result of participating in **Wolfe County Extension** programs:²

- 125 people increased knowledge of diet and exercise changes to improve health.
- 115 people made diet or exercise changes to improve health.
- 62 people experienced a change in knowledge of healthy home practices and stress management.
