


#### **OUR FOCUS**

### **SPOTLIGHT ON ...**

## LOSE IT LOGAN COUNTY!

ccording to the Kentucky Institute of Medicine, 33 percent of adults in Logan County are obese and lack physical activity. To address this need, the Logan County Extension Service promoted "Lose It Logan County!" an eight-week program focused on healthy weight loss and increased physical activity. Twenty-five individuals participated in the program. Data recorded over the course of the program indicated the following: 60 total pounds lost; 26 total inches lost; 16 of 25 participants reduced their waist size. Participants noted greater awareness of food choices and portion control, a significant increase in energy and flexibility, and most could see a visible improvement in their body image.

#### **FAMILY ACCESS**

According to the 2007-2011 American Community Survey,3 in Logan County...

- 19.0% (+/- 4.8) of families with children were below poverty
- 15.0% (+/- 3.1) of those ages 65 and over were below poverty
- 20.5% (+/- 2.1) of households had retirement income
- 6.5% (+/- 1.6) of households had no vehicle

The USDA Food Environment Atlas<sup>4</sup> indicates that in 2010. Logan County had **754** people, **190** children and **108** seniors with low access to a supermarket or large grocery store.\*

In addition, 322 residents had both low income and low access to stores.

#### As a result of participating in **Logan County Extension programs:**<sup>2</sup>

- 180 people are ready to enter the work force.
- **50** people utilized healthy food delivery systems and access points.
- 470 people were involved in addressing community issues.

#### **COMMUNITY AVAILABILITY**

In 2011, Logan County had:

- 6 Grocery stores (any kind)<sup>5</sup>
  - 4 Grocery/supermarkets (except convenience)<sup>5</sup>
  - 2 Convenience stores (i.e. food marts no gas)<sup>5</sup>
- 13 Gasoline stations with convenience stores<sup>5</sup>

In the county, there were:

- 4 Roadside markets that served the county<sup>6</sup>
- 2 Farmers market locations<sup>7</sup>
- 23 SNAP\*\* authorized stores (food stamps)4
- 4 WIC\*\*\* authorized stores4

In 2011, there were \$341,954.40 in SNAP redemptions/per SNAP authorized store in Logan County.4

#### As a result of participating in **Logan County Extension programs:**<sup>2</sup>

- 105 people increased knowledge of healthy food consumption.
- 30 families spent time together in physical activity.
- 85 families/caregivers reported eating more healthy foods.

#### **FOOD ASSISTANCE**

In Logan County...

- 1,819 was the average monthly number of children who received SNAP\*\* (food stamps) in 2011, up from **1,472** children in 2007 (up 23.6%).9
- **56.0%** of students attending public schools were eligible for free or reduced-price meals.9
- There were 2,420 SNAP cases and the monthly SNAP benefit level was \$269.42.8


Logan County is served by Feeding America, Kentucky's Heartland of the Ky. Assoc. of Food Banks.<sup>10</sup>

#### As a result of participating in **Logan County Extension** programs:<sup>2</sup>

- 50 people adopted practices to increase food access and affordability.
- 200 people were reached with information on eating healthy foods.
- **85** youth increased their knowledge of healthy food consumption.
