


#### **OUR FOCUS**

## **COMMUNITY GARDENING**

late It Up! Kentucky Proud" is a multifaceted program encouraging consumers to buy locally and increase their fruit and vegetable consumption. With a grant awarded to the Woodford County Healthy Community Coalition and using "Plate It Up! Kentucky Proud" principles, multiple community gardens were built throughout the county with the goal of promoting healthier lifestyles and reducing obesity. In conjunction with the program, the Woodford County FCS agent taught gardeners how to select, store, prepare, and cook the foods growing in the gardens as well as other locally grown produce. Participants sampled the Plate it Up! Kentucky Proud recipes and learned how to create their own raised beds for gardening.

### **FAMILY ACCESS**

According to the 2007-2011 American Community Survey,3 in Woodford County...

- 16.4% (+/- 5.1) of families with children were below poverty
- 8.2% (+/- 3.5) of those ages 65 and over were below poverty
- 18.7% (+/- 2.6) of households had retirement income
- 5.3% (+/- 1.5) of households had no vehicle

The USDA Food Environment Atlas<sup>4</sup> indicates that in 2010. Woodford County had 6,750 people, 1,828 children and 657 seniors with low access to a supermarket or large grocery store.\*

In addition, **2,004** residents had **both** low income **and** low access to stores.

#### As a result of participating in **Woodford County Extension programs:**<sup>2</sup>

- 155 people demonstrated an increase in practical living skills.
- **185** people utilized healthy food delivery systems and access points.
- 53 people in Managing in Tough Times: Moneywi\$e became aware of how to manage current economic events.

#### **COMMUNITY AVAILABILITY**

In 2011, Woodford County had:

- 5 Grocery stores (any kind)<sup>5</sup>
  - 2 Grocery/supermarkets (except convenience)<sup>5</sup>
  - 3 Convenience stores (i.e. food marts no gas)<sup>5</sup>
- 8 Gasoline stations with convenience stores<sup>5</sup>

In the county, there were:

- 7 Roadside markets that served the county<sup>6</sup>
- 5 Farmers market locations<sup>7</sup>
- 15 SNAP\*\* authorized stores (food stamps)<sup>4</sup>
- 3 WIC\*\*\* authorized stores<sup>4</sup>

In 2011, there were \$242,481.29 in SNAP redemptions/per SNAP authorized store in Woodford County.4

#### As a result of participating in **Woodford County Extension programs:**<sup>2</sup>

- 321 people increased knowledge of healthy food consumption.
- 319 people increased knowledge of safe storage, handling, and preparation of food.
- 65 people reported eating more healthy foods.

#### **FOOD ASSISTANCE**

In Woodford County...

- 1,196 was the average monthly number of children who received SNAP\*\* (food stamps) in 2011, up from **695** children in 2007 (up **72.1%)**.9
- **35.0%** of students attending public schools were eligible for free or reduced-price meals.9
- There were 1,450 SNAP cases and the monthly SNAP benefit level was \$268.28.8

Woodford County is served by God's Pantry Food Bank of the Ky. Assoc. of Food Banks.<sup>10</sup>

#### As a result of participating in **Woodford County Extension** programs:<sup>2</sup>

- 50 people adopted practices to increase food access and affordability.
- 377 families/caregivers were reached with information on accessing healthy foods.
- 261 youth increased their knowledge of healthy food consumption.
