OUR FOCUS

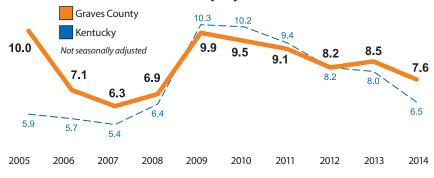

SPOTLIGHT ON...

PROGRAMS FIGHT OBESITY

SDA dietary guidelines say that Americans are overweight and recommend balancing calories to reach a healthy weight. To help in the fight, a nutrition assistant was placed in Graves County to assist the FCS agent in reaching out to eligible youth and adults with SNAP-Ed programming. Within a year, 13 families graduated and 88 continued with the program. Some 85% of the families showed a positive diet change.

FINANCIAL WELL-BEING

In Graves County, the median household income in 2013 was **\$39,960** (+/- **\$3,163**) compared to \$43,307 (+/- \$631) for the state.3

The American Community Survey estimates that between 2009-2013:4

- 21.5% (+/-4.0) of families with related children were below poverty
- 12.1% (+/-2.4) of people age 65 and over were below poverty
- 4.7% (+/-1.4) of individuals working full time/full year in the previous 12 months were below poverty
- 60.5% of students were eligible for free lunches and 5.5% were eligible for reduced-price lunches in 2014-20155

As a result of participating in **Graves County Extension programs:** 1

- 3,065 people demonstrated informed and effective decision-making.
- 3,145 people demonstrated increased practical living skills.

PHYSICAL WELL-BEING

According to the CDC's County Diabetes Atlas, in Graves County in 2012:6

- 11.8% (14.4%-9.5%) of adults reported having been diagnosed with diabetes
- 29.3% (34.1%-24.8%) of adults 18 years and over were obese
- 29.0% (33.6%-24.9%) of adults reported no leisure-time exercise in the past month

Between 2006-2012 in Graves County:7

- 32.3% (39.8%-25.6%) of adults reported having been diagnosed with high blood pressure
- 22.9% (27.4%-19.0%) of adults reported fair or poor health

In Graves County:

- 52.1% had adequate access to locations for physical activity compared to 72.0% for the state8
- 32.7% (+/-3.9) of those who drive to work on their own have a commute that is more than 30 minutes (2009-2013)8
- 23 deaths were from a drug overdose between 2009-20139

As a result of participating in Graves County Extension programs: 1

- 500 people increased knowledge of lifestyle changes to improve personal health.
- 900 children and youth learned to eat more healthy food.

SOCIAL WELL-BEING

The American Community Survey estimates that between 2009-2013 in Graves County:4

- 29.9% (+/-1.2) of households included one or more persons age 65 and over
- 247 (+/-105) grandparents lived with and were responsible for their own grandchildren
- **58.3%** (+/-**7.4**) of children under 6 years and **61.9%** (+/-6.5) of children 6-17 years had all parents in the labor force
- 2,382 (+/-337) of those age 5 and older spoke a language other than English at home
- 2,616 (+/-241) civilian veterans lived in Graves County⁴

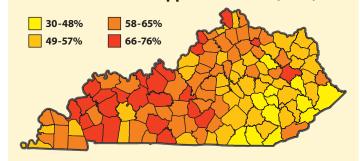
In Graves County:

- 19.4% (25.6%-14.4%) of adults ages 18+ reported they did not receive sufficient social-emotional support between 2006-127
- 112 children were determined to have been victims of child abuse or neglect in 2013¹⁰
- 53.7% of those registered to vote did so in the 2014 General Election¹¹

As a result of participating in **Graves County Extension programs:**1

- 119 adults reported increased leadership skills, knowledge or confidence.
- 585 people were reached with information related to health and safety.
