Money Matters Meals



In the current economy, financial stability is important. Kentucky consistently lags behind in personal income, population living below the poverty line, unemployment, and revolving debt. To educate community members about important financial matters, the Caldwell County's FCS Extension agent hosted a Money Matters Meals series. Topics of discussion included developing a spending/savings plan, discovering how habits and attitudes affect spending habits, budgeting for the holidays, and creating low-cost meals. All participants stated they are thinking differently about how they manage money as a result of the program. Participants plan to develop a spending/savings plan. In the future, participants committed to tracking expenses, reducing spending leaks, and spending money on their needs before their wants.
