SPOTLIGHT: FRANKLIN COUNTY

Life Story



Franklin County's FCS Extension agent presented Life Story as a leader lesson to Ft. Harrod Area Homemaker leaders. These leaders would facilitate the lesson at the club meeting. As a result of the program, participants demonstrated an increase in knowledge regarding basic concepts of Life Story. Many of the ladies expressed aspirations to document their life stories. All participants verbally expressed that they felt the program enhanced personal meaning and understanding. Participants anticipate using Life Story as a way to communicate and strengthen relationships with family members (siblings and grandchildren) and plan to use Life Story in a caregiving relationship, as well as to think about future planning and decision-making. This program has proven to contribute to healthy and quality aging throughout the life course.
