SPOTLIGHT: HICKMAN COUNTY

Born Learning in Hickman County



Quality early learning experiences for all children are a key driver of school readiness, vital to improving high school graduation rates, and critical to a community's economic success. A child's early years, from birth until school age, are a unique period of growth and development. Hickman County's FCS Extension collaborated with the Hickman County Board of Education, Hickman County Family Resource Center, and Nutrition Education Program Assistant to reach parents of children ages infant through 5 about school readiness, child development, and nutrition through Born Learning Academy at Hickman County Schools. Families met for six sessions. Participants reported that they learned 10 or more strategies around building routines and learning, reading together at home, building language opportunities, understanding sleep and nutrition needs, and practicing social skills.
