SPOTLIGHT: NICHOLAS COUNTY

Creating and Maintaining Family Traditions



Nicholas County's FCS Extension in collaboration with the Nicholas County Family Youth Resource Center provided a program on family traditions. Strong families play an important role in the community and contribute to society overall. To help strengthen families, FCS Extension offered the Creating and Maintaining Family Traditions program. Emphasis was on the characteristics of creating and maintaining family traditions and then helping strong families create and maintain their own traditions. Participants indicated that their family traditions provided a source of identity, strengthened their family bond, offered a degree of comfort and security, connected generations, and passed on cultural and religious heritage. Overall, participants connected strong families to traditions and planned to maintain current traditions or work to create new ones.
