SPOTLIGHT: WEBSTER COUNTY Saving Families Money



In Webster County, 18.7 percent of families with children lived below the poverty level in 2015. Webster County's FCS Extension agent presented a program titled Couponing and Apps for families to learn to save money at the grocery store and improve the family's financial management. The class discussed menu planning, identified food resource management techniques, located coupons to save money, learned to organize coupons, discussed downloading secure coupon or money saving apps, and learned to create a plan for savings. Participants reported increased knowledge about the basics of couponing, importance of budgeting, and maintaining financial stability. They also stated that they have become more organized when shopping and have saved money on groceries since attending the class.

participants reported gaining knowledge.

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
