SPOTLIGHT: BRECKINRIDGE COUNTY

Healthy Cast Iron Cooking



Research shows that family traditions along with healthy lifestyle choices are important in an individual's resiliency. Tradition creates a sense of belonging while cooking at home encourages healthier lifestyle choices. The Homemaker lesson Healthy Cast Iron Cooking combines these two important elements. Participants completed a learning session of selection, care, and use of cast iron cookware, addressing rust, how to season or reseason cast iron. Participants reviewed the benefits of cooking with cast iron with the MyPlate information. The class demonstrated and sampled a delicious low-fat artichoke dip recipe to reinforce the benefits of cooking with cast iron. After the program, participants reported having a better understanding of how cast iron cooking could be a part of a healthy diet, and that they are more likely to cook with cast iron moving forward.
