Nutrition Education helps pack a lunch



As the COVID-19 pandemic hit, the Bullitt County Public Schools Food Service Program found themselves preparing and delivering more than 6,000 meals to children qualified for the free and reduced lunch program throughout the county. As they began the process, the Food Service director identified the need for a fun but educational flyer to be include with the meals. Since the Food Service employees were focused on preparing the food, Bullitt County Extension offered to provide that educational flyer. For 12 weeks, the agents of 4-H, Agriculture, and Family and Consumer Sciences teamed up with the school food service to provide educational nutrition flyers to the children. This partnership created a great opportunity to raise awareness of the Bullitt County Extension Service to an audience not frequently participating in our programs.
