SPOTLIGHT: FRANKLIN COUNTY

Virtual 5K in May draws 600 participants



Low levels of physical activity, unhealthy nutrition, and poor mental health are all determinants of several chronic diseases. FitBlueKY, a smartphone-based application, is a four-week walking challenge focused on increasing participants' participation in regular physical activity, choosing a nutritious diet, and improving health outcomes for Kentucky citizens. As an innovative strategy to improve mental health and increase movement, the Family and Consumer Sciences Cooperative Extension implemented the "5K in May," the goal being to finish a virtual 5K race at the end of the month. More than 600 Kentuckians registered for the challenge, with 32 participants crossing that 5K finish line for the first time.
