SPOTLIGHT: GRAYSON COUNTY LEAD with Extension



Effective leadership is one factor necessary for success within today's communities and organizations. Knowledge and skills are needed by leaders and managers to properly train and retain good employees. To fill that gap, the Grayson County Family and Consumer Sciences Extension developed a program specifically for the members of the Grayson County Chamber of Commerce titled LEAD with Extension, using the KELD (Kentucky Extension Leadership Development) curriculum. We held classes monthly with an average of 27 people attending five sessions. Statistically significant gains in ability were reported across 16 measures. About 95% of participants reported that they could use the ideas and skills learned to either a moderate or great extent. One participant reported that they have a better understanding of how their co-workers learn and how to have better staff meetings.

GRAYSON COUNTY'S EXTENSION PROGRAMMING COMMUNITY IMPACT
