SPOTLIGHT: METCALFE COUNTY

Stories, Songs, and Stretches



In many Kentucky counties, limited resources or the environment may serve as barriers for healthy lifestyle choices related to early childhood development and physical activity. As an innovative strategy to improve early childhood development and increase movement with local residents, the Metcalfe County Family and Consumer Sciences Extension agent partnered with The Metcalfe County Head Start Child Development Center, to implement Stories, Songs, and Stretches. Through this program, participants work on improving early childhood development and increasing physical activity. Because of this program, according to classroom staff reports and observations, 82% of the participants improved gross motor skills. All participants improved social skills as well as attention and enthusiasm for daily classroom group storytimes, after incorporating more movement and participatory elements.

METCALFE COUNTY'S EXTENSION PROGRAMMING COMMUNITY IMPACT
