SPOTLIGHT: OHIO COUNTY

To-go kits help locals grow gardens



The onset of COVID-19 created a new paradigm for many across the U.S. and Kentucky. With so many people off work, raising vegetables in a garden became more popular. To assist locals, the Agriculture agents and the Ohio County Family and Consumer Sciences Extension agent prepared "to-go kits" about gardening and composting. Kits were available for pick-up at the Extension office, we distributed them to Food Pantry participants, and we made them available at a local Hispanic store. The to-go kits included publications on preparing a garden; how to plant and maintain the garden; seed packets of green beans, cucumbers, and squash; composting basics; and Healthy at Home information. We reached more than 800 families through the to-go packets.
