SPOTLIGHT: OWSLEY COUNTY

SuperStar Chef cooking camp



According to 2017 data from the State of Obesity website, the obesity rate for children ages 10 to 17 in Kentucky is 19.3%. This places Kentucky at third highest in the nation for childhood obesity rates in this age group. Recent research has indicated that teaching cooking skills to children encourages healthier food choices, which can lower obesity rates. In an effort to address this problem, the Owsley County Family and Consumer Sciences Extension agent partnered with the University of Kentucky Nutrition Education Program to present SuperStar Chef, a three-day camp for students ages 9 through 12 that is designed to teach kitchen safety, food safety, nutrition concepts, and physical activity. Of those who participated, 94% reported intending to make healthier eating habits moving forward.
