SPOTLIGHT: PULASKI COUNTY

COVID-19 provides opportunity for giving



The Pulaski County Cooperative Extension Service empowers communities to respond to challenges they face, and reacting to the COVID-19 pandemic has been no different. One of the first challenges COVID-19 presented was the shortage of masks available to all people in the community. The Pulaski County Extension Service provided materials, threads, and elastic with the CDC's directions for making the masks to interested sewers in the county. Volunteers made more than 3,500 facemasks. We gave them to individuals, companies, and organizations looking for masks. In the Lake Cumberland area of District 5, the Somerset KCTCS campus used 3-D printers to make headbands for face shields that Extension agents assembled. We assembled more than 3,000 face shields.
