Family bags provide quality programming at home



The beginning of 2020 began like any other year with Extension, but because of the COVID-19 global pandemic, Kentuckians were forced to quarantine at home, with youths and families spending more time together. From March to July, the Bracken County FCS Extension Office provided weekly grab and go family bags to help educate and fill the time spent at home with quality programming. Each bag included publications and/or some activities. The topics included gardening, science activities, meal planning, Budget 101, food safety, hand-washing, farmers' market, Plate it Up!, character education, physical activity, and healthy snacks. Pickup times were coordinated with school lunch pickup. In the five months of the program, we handed out more than 700 bags.
