SPOTLIGHT: CARLISLE COUNTY

Feeding Carlisle through Community Pantry Boxes



According to FeedingAmerica.org, 16.4% of Carlisle County residents are food insecure. The effects of COVID-19 on the community have only increased those numbers because of job loss and food inaccessibility. In an attempt to combat these statistics and get food onto the plates of their residents, the Carlisle County FCS Extension Office in partnership with the Carlisle County Family Resource Center (FRYSC) sponsored Free Community Pantry Boxes in communities across the county. Through community fundraising, donated services, and program funds, we were able provide the county with two pantry cabinets large enough to house food and sanitary items. We presented the boxes to Bardwell and Arlington townships. It is the hope of those involved to continue the project and add more boxes throughout the county.
